

Poirot is traveling on a train. Where a murder mystery takes place that both he and the readers cannot solve. One of Christie's most famous plot twists has a stunning ending.





The story is set in the background of Egypt's Nile River. It is a masterclass in suspense and deception. One of the finest work done by Agatha.





One of the finest mystery novels that has ever been written is this book. It has a twisting end that transformed the genre. And introduce readers to another world.









In this story, Miss Marple investigates a young woman's body that we found inside the library of a very beautiful house.





Ten strangers go to a distant island, And then they are accused of prior misdeeds and die one by one. This is Christie's best-selling novel and suspense masterpiece.





This courtroom drama, which began as a short fiction, explores the complexity of truth and justice.






