The American Booksellers Association founded the National Book Award in 1950 with the primary objective of recognizing and encouraging excellence in American writing. Since its debut, the prize has risen in reputation and significance, expanding to encompass fiction, nonfiction, poetry, and children's literature categories. Since 1986, the National Book Foundation, a non-profit organization, has managed the award, and it has remained committed to recognizing excellent literary achievements.

National Book Award: Categories and Eligibility

The National Book Award honors achievement in the following categories:
