NLCIL completes permanent diversion of Paravanar course



7th edition of Secretariat Reforms report released



20th ASEAN-India Economic Minister meeting


India participated in the 20th ASEAN-India Economic Ministers meeting in Semarang, Indonesia. Rajesh Agarwal, Additional Secretary of the Department of Commerce co-chaired the meeting with Dr Zulfikifli Hasan, Minister of Trade, Indonesia. Economic Minister's or their representatives from all 10 ASEAN countries Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand and Vietnam participated in the meeting.

Key Points:

- A) Bilateral trade and investment relations between India and ASEAN were reviewed to enhance economic partnership.
- B) India and ASEAN registered bilateral trade of USD 131.5 billion in 2022-23.
- C) Trade with ASEAN accounted for 11.3% of India's global trade in 2022-23.

About ASEAN:

The Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology(MeitY) announced the 1st Joint call for proposals under the MeitY-National Science Foundation research collaboration. MeitY-NSF has signed an Implementation agreement on research collaboration in May 2023.

Key Points:

- A) Research collaboration focuses upon discoveries and Innovations in areas of mutual interest.
- B) 1st joint call addresses proposals in the areas of Semiconductors research, next generation communication technologies, cyber security, sustainability and green technologies and Intelligent Transportation systems.
- C) Technology Development may be in terms of development of prototypes, pilot scale demonstrations, field deployment and acceleration of technology transfer.




DRDOs TAPAS UAV crashed in Karnataka

TAPAS Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (UAV) developed by DRDO crashes in Agricultural fields of a village in Karnataka. The UAV-TAPAS fell outside Vaddikere village in Hiriyur Taluk. DRDO said there was no collateral damage from the crash of TAPAS. DRDO is briefing the Ministry about the mishap and enquiry is being carried out into specific reasons behind the crash.

About TAPAS UAV:

- A) Stands for The Tactical Airborne Platform for Aerial Surveillance-Beyond Horizon-201 or TAPAS BH-201.
- B) It is a long endurance UAV previously called RUSTOM 2.
- C) Drone has a 20.6 metre wingspan and maximum speed of 225 kmph.
- D) Its real time data collection and transmission provide valuable intelligence for decision making.
- E) It can also cover 1000+ km via SATCOM using the Ku band frequency and GAGAN system.
- F) It is being developed by Aeronautical Development Establishment in India.

Last survivors of Piripkura Tribe found in Brazil


Pakyi and Tamandua, final known isolated members of Piripkura tribe found in Brazil. Tamandua Piripkura spent his entire life eluding capture from modernity. They lived in the Amazon region of South America. Indigenous people have been killed all across the world for millennia as they are considered barriers to progress.

Key Points:

- A) The two members of the tribe are at the focus of a wider issue of the future of Amazon and the local people that Brazil has been debating for years.
- B) Only two Piripkura tribe members are known to reside in the region while many are suspected to be hidden deep in the forest.
- C) Jair Candour discovered Pakyi and Tamandua for the first time in 1989.

About Piripkura Tribe:

- A) Nomadic tribe from the Mato Grosso region of Brazil.
- B) Known for its isolation and efforts to maintain its traditional way of life.
- C) Their territory has been under threat from deforestation and resource extraction.

Assam Police recently rescued six Palm Cockatoos (Probosciger Aterrimus) birds from Cachar district of Assam. They are Australian exotic birds. The smugglers left the cages with birds inside them and fled the spot as police approached. The exotic birds will be taken to the Guwahati Zoo for a safer place.

About Palm Cockatoo:

Cholera Outbreak in Congo

UNICEF recently reported the worst cholera outbreak since 2017 affecting children in Congo. DRC reported more cholera cases in the first seven months of 2023 than all of 2022. Cholera cases are under-reported globally. It is endemic in several parts of DRC with 189,000 cases reported every year.

Key Points:

- A) The overcrowded displacement camps have become the breeding grounds for cholera transmission.
- B) Survey also showed that families living in cholera hotspots faced multiple other health risks like malnutrition and lack of access to parental care and vaccinations.
- C) To combat the emergency UNICEF has called for 62.5 million dollars to enhance its prevention and response activities to cholera and water sanitation and hygiene (WASH) crisis.

About UNICEF:

- A) Stands for United Nations Children's Fund.

- D) Its headquarters are located in Bilaspur, Chattisgarh.




Spain won FIFA Women's World Cup
