India Issues First Guidelines for Animal Blood Banks

India has released its first national guidelines for animal blood banks, issued on 25 August 2025 by the Department of Animal Husbandry and Dairying. The framework ensures standardized veterinary blood transfusion with donor screening, blood typing, biosafety, and ethical practices under a voluntary donation model. States will establish regulated blood banks, supported by a digital network for inventory and donor registries. Integrated into veterinary education, the initiative strengthens One Health, safeguards animal welfare, supports rural livelihoods, and enhances India's agrarian economy.

Goldman Sachs Projects \$9.5 Trillion Financial Inflows into India by 2035

Goldman Sachs projects that India's household financial savings will generate \$9.5 trillion in cumulative inflows into financial assets by 2035, reflecting a shift from physical assets to financial instruments. Household savings are expected to average 13% of GDP, up from 11.6% over the past decade. Major inflows will include insurance, pensions, bank deposits, equities, and mutual funds. This trend will strengthen domestic capital for corporate growth, develop long-term bond markets, boost retail investment, and enhance financial inclusion and wealth management in India.

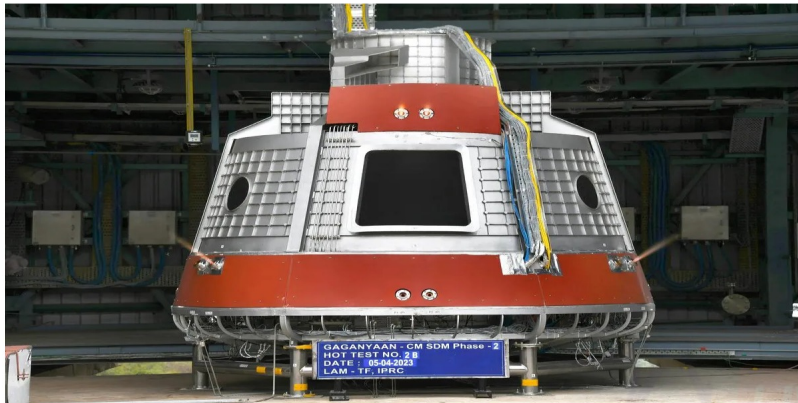

ISRO Completes First Gaganyaan Air Drop Test Successfully

On August 24, 2025, ISRO successfully conducted the first Integrated Air Drop Test (IADT-01) for the Gaganyaan program at Sriharikota. The test validated the parachute-based deceleration system of the Crew Module in a typical mission scenario. Using a Chinook helicopter, a simulated Crew Module (~4.8 tons) was dropped from 3 km, deploying ten parachutes in sequence to reduce terminal velocity to 8 m/s for safe splashdown. The module was recovered by INS Anvesha. The test involved ISRO, DRDO, Indian Navy, Air Force, and Coast Guard, ensuring mission readiness.

India to Host First Asian Open Short Track Speed Skating Trophy 2025

India will host the Asian Open Short Track Speed Skating Trophy 2025 for the first time from August 20–23 at Maharana Pratap Sports College, Raipur, Dehradun. Over 11 Asian countries, including China, Japan, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Singapore, Thailand, Chinese Taipei, Vietnam, Malaysia, the Philippines, and India, will participate. Athletes will compete in nine events ranging from the 222-meter sprint to the 5000-meter relay. This historic event marks India's debut in organizing a major international winter sports competition, promoting sports development and regional collaboration.
