Air Quality Dashboard

The Air Quality Dashboard was recently unveiled by the International Centre for Integrated Mountain Development (ICIMOD) to offer real time and forecasted data on air pollution. It consists of a dynamic timelapse powered by the Weather Research and Forecasting Model coupled with Chemistry (WRF-Chem). Its objective is to provide a view of air pollution across regional and sub regional scales.

Global One-Stop Centres (OSCs)

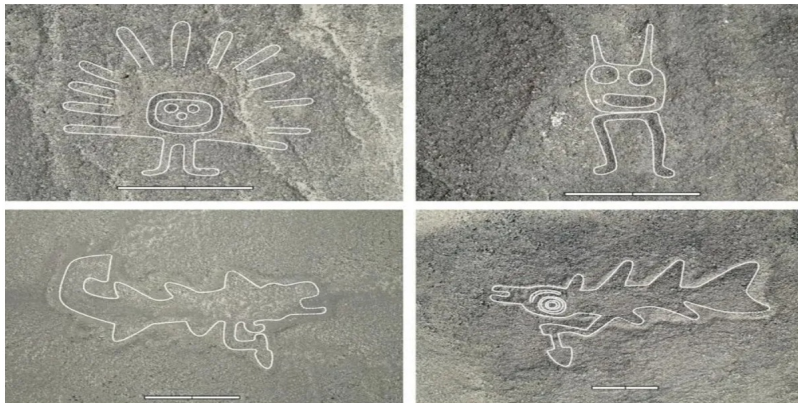
The Empowered committee of the Ministry of Women and Child Development has recently approved the establishment of nine Global One-Stop Centres (OSCs). The center will provide assistance to women in vulnerable situations and provide critical support. Seven out of Nine centres will consist of shelter homes and will be set up in Kuwait, Oman, Saudi Arabia, Bahrain, UAE and Qatar while two centers without shelter homes will be located in Toronto and Singapore. It is an initiative of the Ministry of External Affairs.

AI used to discover Nazca Geoglyphs

Researchers have recently discovered mysterious Nazca Geoglyphs in Peru using Artificial Intelligence. The discovery took place some 400 km South of Lima, Peru on the barren Nazca Pampa. Nazca Lines can be described as a group of Geoglyphs made on ground by creators using elements like stones, gravel, dirt etc. Geoglyphs can be described as motifs created on the ground by manipulating surface stones, soil and gravel. It was systematically studied for the first time in 1926 by Peruvian Archaeologist Toribio Mejia Xesspe.

Packaged drinking and mineral water categorised as High Risk Food

Packaged drinking and mineral water have recently been classified as a “High Risk Food” by the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI). Food Products under this category are subjected to mandatory risk-based inspections. Manufacturers producing high risk category food products shall get their businesses audited annually. FSSAI established under the Food Safety and Standards Act, 2006 is an autonomous body under the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare.

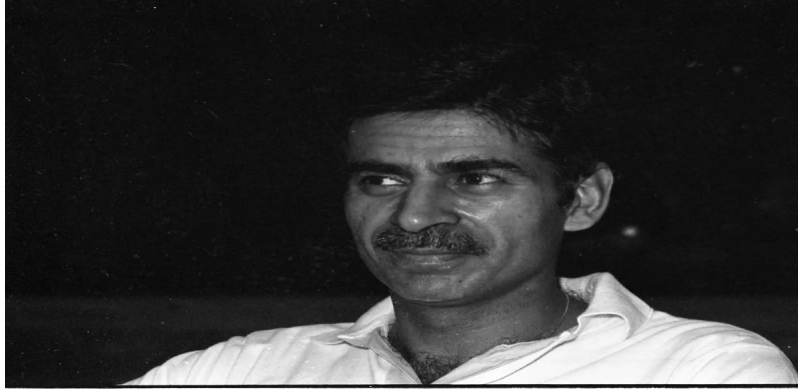
