SBI Revises India's FY25 GDP Growth Forecast Down to 6.3%

The State Bank of India (SBI) has revised India's GDP growth forecast for FY25 to 6.3%, slightly below the NSO's projection of 6.4%. This adjustment reflects concerns over slowing momentum in lending, manufacturing, and aggregate demand. Growth in agriculture is expected to rise, while industrial and services sectors show slower growth. Private consumption is projected at 7.3%, but investment growth has slowed. To support growth, the government has introduced fiscal reforms, and the RBI has reduced the repo rate.

He also became India's highest wicket-taker in ICC ODI events, with 60 wickets in 19 matches. Shami's record-breaking performance included a five-wicket haul in the India vs Bangladesh Champions Trophy match. His remarkable strike rate of 15.5 in ICC tournaments highlights his efficiency. After recovering from surgery, Shami made a strong comeback with determination and support from his team.

India Takes Over Chairmanship of Bay of Bengal Inter-Governmental Organisation

India assumed the Chairmanship of the Bay of Bengal Programme Inter-Governmental Organisation (BOBP-IGO) from Bangladesh during the 13th Governing Council Meeting in Malé, Maldives. Led by Dr. Abhilaksh Likhi, India's focus will include sustainable fisheries, small-scale fishers' welfare, marine resource management, and combating IUU fishing. This leadership aligns with India's national vision of 'Viksit Bharat 2047,' aiming for economic growth and environmental sustainability. India's role will strengthen regional cooperation and promote responsible fishing practices across the Bay of Bengal.

A new bat coronavirus, HKU5-CoV-2, has been discovered in China

Researchers in China have discovered a new bat coronavirus, HKU5-CoV-2, which can infect human cells through the ACE2 receptor, similar to SARS-CoV-2. Though its binding efficiency to human cells is lower, the virus possesses a furin cleavage site, enhancing its infectivity. While experts note that immunity to SARS-like viruses may limit its impact, continuous surveillance of bat coronaviruses is crucial to prevent potential outbreaks. Global cooperation, early detection, and biosecurity measures are recommended to mitigate future risks.

The first astronaut with a disability has been approved for a mission to the ISS

The European Space Agency (ESA) has cleared British astronaut John McFall, a former Paralympian with a prosthetic leg, for long-duration missions to the International Space Station (ISS). McFall, who lost his leg in a motorcycle accident, was part of ESA's 2022 feasibility study on astronauts with disabilities. His certification marks a significant milestone in making space exploration more inclusive, challenging traditional astronaut selection criteria. While McFall has not been assigned a specific mission yet, he remains on standby for future assignments.

India's First Wildlife Biobank Opens at the Darjeeling Zoo

India's first zoo-based wildlife biobank has been established at Darjeeling's Padmaja Naidu Himalayan Zoological Park (PNHNP). This facility stores genetic materials from endangered species, aiding in conservation and scientific research. As of February 2025, it holds samples from 60 animals across 23 species. Additionally, the zoo launched an animal museum with a pathology lab and a skeleton museum to enhance conservation efforts. This initiative, part of India's broader wildlife strategy, aims to preserve biodiversity and support future species revival.

Uttarakhand Imposes Stricter Land Laws for Non-Residents

Uttarakhand's Cabinet approved the Bhoo Kanoon (Land Law Amendment Bill) on February 19, 2025, to regulate land transactions by non-residents. The law bans agricultural land purchases in 11 hill districts, limits residential land sizes, and introduces a digital portal for transparency. It aims to protect cultural heritage, citizens' rights, and the state's identity while allowing exceptions for certain districts. The law also includes provisions to prevent land misuse and support industrial investment. The bill will be tabled during the Budget session.

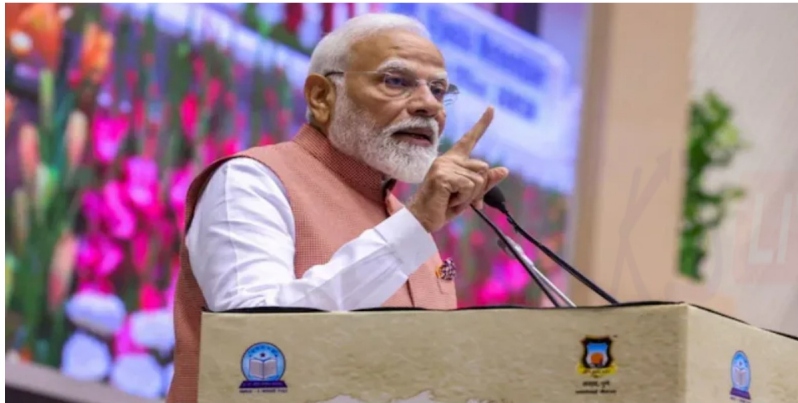
