Rajasthan Introduces Its Inaugural Green Budget

Rajasthan Deputy CM and Finance Minister Diya Kumari presented the state's first Green Budget for 2025-26, with a ₹5.37 lakh crore outlay. Prioritizing electricity, roads, water, health, and agriculture, the budget aligns with SDGs 2030. Key initiatives include ₹27,854 crore for green projects, a Climate Change Adaptation Plan, and water harvesting in 4,700+ villages. It also allocates funds for infrastructure, energy, agriculture, tourism, employment, and social welfare while aiming to generate 2.75 lakh jobs and improve the law, health, and education sectors.

ISRO Develops the World's Largest Vertical Propellant Mixer

ISRO, in collaboration with CMTI, has developed the world's largest 10-tonne vertical planetary mixer for solid propellant production, enhancing efficiency and safety in rocket motor manufacturing. Handed over on February 13, 2025, the mixer features hydrostatic agitators, PLC-based remote operation, and SCADA systems for precise mixing. Weighing 150 tonnes and measuring 8.7 meters in height, it marks a significant step in India's self-reliance in space technology, supporting indigenous advancements in critical aerospace manufacturing.

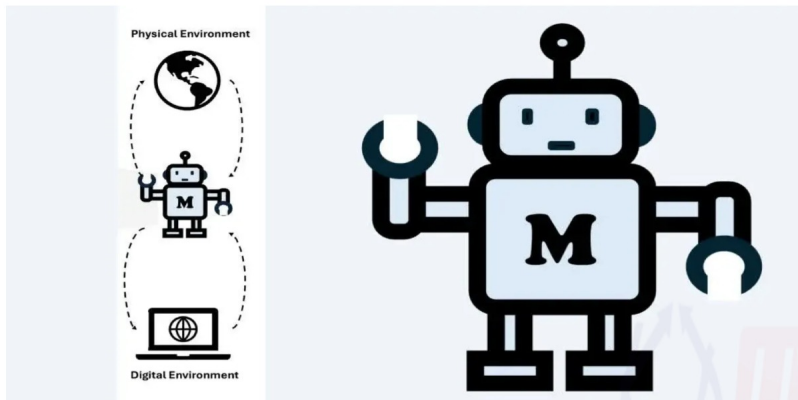

Kerala Launches Nayanamritham 2.0

Kerala's integration of AI enhances screening efficiency, early diagnosis, and accessibility, setting a global benchmark for AI in public health.

India's suicide rate has decreased by 30% over the past three decades

A recent Lancet study based on the Global Burden of Diseases report shows that India's suicide rate has dropped by 30% from 1990 to 2021. The overall suicide rate decreased from 18.9 to 13 per lakh, with a significant decline among females. Key factors behind this decline include the decriminalization of suicide under the Mental Healthcare Act of 2017, the National Suicide Prevention Strategy, and various mental health initiatives like the National Mental Health Policy and helplines such as Manodarpan and KIRAN.
