## Prime Minister Modi will inaugurate the new Pamban Rail Bridge.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will visit Rameshwaram on Ram Navami, April 6, to pray at the Ramanathaswamy Temple and inaugurate the new Pamban Bridge. This 2.10 km-long vertical lift rail bridge will replace the old British-era bridge, ensuring better rail connectivity between Mandapam and Pamban Island. The modern design allows a 72.5-meter span to lift for smooth ship navigation. The project, delayed due to COVID-19, began in February 2020 after PM Modi laid the foundation in 2019 and is set to be operational by April 2025.

Tamil actor-director Manoj Bharathiraja, son of legendary filmmaker Bharathiraja, passed away at 48 due to cardiac arrest at his Chennai residence on March 25, 2025. He had undergone bypass surgery days before. Manoj, known for films like Taj Mahal and Samudhiram, also worked as an assistant director on Enthiran. He made his directorial debut with Margazhi Thingal (2023). Survived by his wife Nandana and two daughters, his sudden demise has left the Tamil film industry in mourning.

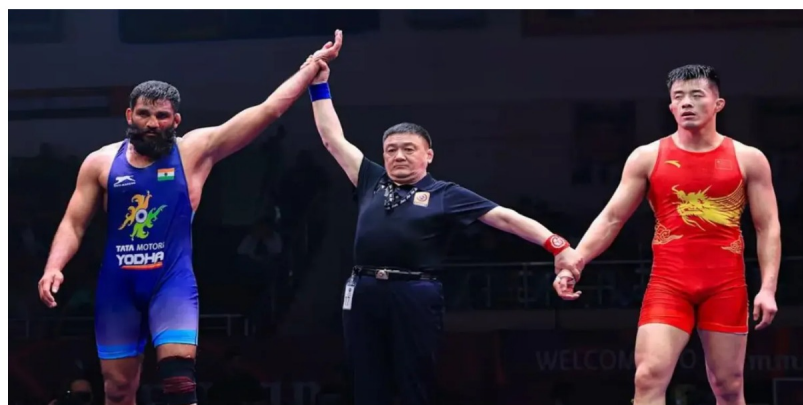

## Sunil Kumar Clinches Bronze at the 2025 Asian Wrestling Championships

Indian wrestler Sunil Kumar won a bronze medal in the 87kg Greco-Roman category at the Asian Wrestling Championship in Amman, Jordan. He secured victory over China's Jiaxin Huang after losing to Iran's Yasin Yazdi in the semifinals. Earlier, he defeated Tajikistan's Sukhrob Abdulkhaev 10-1 in the quarterfinals. Other Indian wrestlers, including Sagar Thakran (77kg), Umesh (63kg), Nitin (55kg), and Prem (130kg), faced early eliminations. Sunil, a 2019 silver medallist, aims to regain his top form.

## Reliance Acquires Nauyaan Tradings to Expand Shipyard Operations

Reliance Industries Ltd (RIL) acquired 100% equity in Nauyaan Tradings Private Limited (NTPL) via its subsidiary, Reliance Strategic Business Ventures Ltd. NTPL, now a step-down subsidiary of RIL, also signed a deal to acquire a 74% stake in Nauyaan Shipyard Private Limited (NSPL) for Rs 382.73 crore. Located in Dahej, Gujarat, NSPL holds 138 acres of land for shipyard and industrial use. The acquisition aligns with Reliance's expansion in shipbuilding, engineering, and hydrogen electrolyser manufacturing.

## India Emerges as the World's Leading Milk Producer

India has become the world's top milk producer with a current production of 239 million metric tons (MMT), contributing over 24% of global output. The government aims to increase this to 300 MMT by 2030. The Rashtriya Gokul Mission (RGM), launched in 2014, has played a key role in boosting milk production and cattle genetics. Despite challenges like low productivity, cattle diseases, and inadequate cold storage, India is focusing on AI technology, disease control, climate resilience, and exports for sustainable growth.

## India and Singapore Sign a Letter of Intent for Green and Digital Shipping Corridor

India and Singapore have signed a Letter of Intent (LoI) for a Green and Digital Shipping Corridor (GDSC) to promote maritime digitalization and decarbonization. The agreement focuses on advancing zero or near-zero greenhouse gas (GHG) emission technologies and digital solutions. Signed by officials from both nations, the initiative will be formalized through a Memorandum of Understanding. The collaboration highlights India's potential in green marine fuels and Singapore's role as a global shipping hub, fostering sustainable maritime trade and innovation.

## Former Cabinet Secretary Rajiv Gauba Appointed as a Full-Time Member of NITI Aayog

Rajiv Gauba, former Cabinet Secretary, has been appointed as the fifth full-time member of NITI Aayog. A retired 1982-batch IAS officer from the Jharkhand cadre, Gauba played a key role in governance reforms and the execution of the Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation Act, 2019. His experience includes serving as Union Home Secretary and Chief Secretary of Jharkhand. The appointment, approved by the Prime Minister, adds to the existing members—Vijay Kumar Saraswat, Ramesh Chand, Vinod Kumar Paul, and Arvind Virmani.

## S&P Revises India's FY26 Growth Forecast Down to 6.5%

S&P Global has lowered India's GDP growth forecast for FY26 by 20 basis points to 6.5%, citing expectations of a normal monsoon and stable commodity prices. The agency highlighted factors supporting growth, including cooling food inflation, tax benefits, and lower borrowing costs. It also projected a 75-100 basis point rate cut by the RBI. While India's services-led exports remain resilient, global trade tensions, including US tariffs on China, may impact international growth. The report noted that India's economy remains strong despite global uncertainties.

## Supreme Court Forms National Task Force to Address Student Mental Health Issues

The Supreme Court has established a 10-member National Task Force, led by former Justice S. Ravindra Bhat, to address student mental health issues in higher education. Concerned over rising student suicides, the court cited NCRB data showing over 13,000 cases in 2021. The task force will analyze regulations on ragging, discrimination, and harassment, recommend legal reforms, and conduct surprise inspections. An interim report is due in four months, with a final report in eight months. The move follows multiple student suicides across India.

## Ajinkya Rahane Makes IPL History

Ajinkya Rahane made IPL history by becoming the first Indian player to captain three different franchises—Rising Pune Supergiant (2017), Rajasthan Royals (2018-2019), and Kolkata Knight Riders (2025). Before him, only Kumar Sangakkara, Mahela Jayawardene, and Steve Smith had captained three IPL teams. Shreyas Iyer will join this elite list as Punjab Kings' captain in IPL 2025. Iyer, previously leading Delhi Capitals and KKR, aims to be the first captain to win IPL titles with two different teams.
