Dr. S. Jaishankar Reaches Brisbane, Australia

External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar arrived in Brisbane for a six-day trip to Australia and Singapore. Throughout this visit, Dr. Jaishankar is set to inaugurate India's fourth consulate in Australia, located in Brisbane. Additionally, he will cochair the 15th Foreign Ministers' Framework Dialogue alongside his Australian counterpart, Penny Wong, in Canberra. The External Affairs Minister is also scheduled to deliver the keynote address at the inaugural session of the second Raisina Down Under, which will take place in the Australian Parliament House.

Indian startup ecosystem reaches 12.2 billion dollars

The Indian startup ecosystem has achieved a remarkable funding total of 12.2 billion dollars within the first ten months of this year. This figure has already exceeded the total funding raised throughout 2023, with two months remaining in the year. In October alone, domestic startups secured over 1 billion dollars through 119 transactions. September recorded the second-highest funding level at 1.63 billion dollars, following a peak of 1.92 billion dollars noted in June. In October, the growth and late-stage funding sector accounted for 28 deals, contributing 846.2 million dollars to the overall funding total.









Telangana Govt grants sanction for Hyderabad Metro Phase II

The Telangana government has granted administrative approval for the Hyderabad Metro Rail Phase II project, which is estimated to cost ₹24,269 crore. This initiative will be executed as a joint venture with the central government. The project will encompass five Metro corridors spanning a total of 76.4 kilometers, with both the state government, through Hyderabad Airport Metro Limited, and the central government sharing the investment equally at a 50:50 ratio.

The managing committee of the Armed Forces Flag Day Fund in Telangana, under the leadership of Governor Jishnu Dev Varma, has sanctioned financial assistance programs for ex-servicemen and their families. Among the significant resolutions made, the committee will allocate Rs 3 lakh to the parents of unmarried soldiers, Rs 2.5 lakh to the parents of married soldiers, and Rs 3 lakh to the spouses of married soldiers who have lost their lives in service. Additionally, the monthly allowances for fully disabled soldiers have been raised from Rs 12,000 to Rs 15,000.

NSE launches mobile app & websites in 8 additional languages

The National Stock Exchange has introduced a mobile application and websites in eight new languages to celebrate its 30 years of operation. The NSE began trading in the equities market on November 3, 1994. Ashishkumar Chauhan, the Managing Director and CEO of NSE, stated that the newly added languages are Assamese, Bengali, Kannada, Malayalam, Odia, Punjabi, Tamil, and Telugu, which increases the total number of languages available on the NSE platform to twelve.

India's Atanu Das bags Bronze Medal in Swiss Open Indoor Archery

India's Atanu Das has secured a bronze medal at the Swiss Open Indoor Archery event held in Lausanne, Switzerland. In the Recurve Men's bronze medal match, Olympian Atanu Das triumphed over Switzerland's Thomas Rufer with a score of 6-4. Prior to this, Atanu experienced a setback in the semifinals, where he was defeated by France's Romain Fichet with a score of 4-6. Romain subsequently earned the silver medal, while Italy's Alessandro Paoli took home the gold.

Krisha Verma clinches Gold Medal at U19 World Boxing Championships

India's Krisha Verma secured a gold medal at the U19 World Boxing Championships held in Colorado, USA. Unfortunately, five other Indian boxers competing for gold medals were unsuccessful in their respective finals. Krisha triumphed over Lerika Simon from Germany with a decisive score of 5-0 to claim the gold medal. In contrast, Chanchal Chaudhary faced defeat against Ruby White of England in the female 48 kg category final, resulting in her disqualification and a silver medal finish.

G20 issues its first Ministerial Declaration on Disaster Risk Reduction

A high-level Indian delegation actively participated in a G20 meeting that successfully reached a consensus on the inaugural Ministerial declaration concerning Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR), as stated in an official announcement. The G20 Disaster Risk Reduction Working Group (DRRWG) Ministerial Meeting took place from October 30 to November 1, 2024, in Belem, Brazil. During various Ministerial sessions, P. K. Mishra, Principal Secretary to the Prime Minister, highlighted the advancements made by the Government of India in mitigating disaster risks and enhancing disaster financing within the nation, according to the statement.





Construction of 12 river bridges completed for bullet train corridor in Gujarat

The officials have announced that the construction of 12 out of the 20 river bridges planned for the 508-kilometer Mumbai-Ahmedabad bullet train corridor in Gujarat has been finalized. The recently completed bridge, measuring 120 meters in length, spans the Kharera River in the Navsari district and marks the 12th bridge to be finished in the state, according to the National High Speed Rail Corporation Limited (NHSRCL). This bullet train initiative encompasses a distance of 352 kilometers in Gujarat and 156 kilometers in Maharashtra, with a total of 12 stations designated at locations including Mumbai, Thane, Virar, Boisar, Vapi, Bilimora, Surat, Bharuch, Vadodara, Anand/Nadiad, Ahmedabad, and Sabarmati
