Duma Boko from the Umbrella for Democratic Change (UDC) has replaced Botswana Democratic Party's (BDP) Mokgweetsi Masisi to become the sixth President of Botswana. The result of the elections was announced by Chief Justice Terence Rannowane. Elections in Botswana are held to choose 61 members for the National Assembly and 609 local councillors.
