

Maldivian President visits India





In an offensive aimed at destroying Israel's defence, Iran recently formed more than 180 ballistic missiles including Fattah-2 which is a Hypersonic medium range missile. The missile is equipped with a Hypersonic Glide Vehicle (HGV) warhead and uses a liquid fuel rocket propellant. The missile has a range of 1500 kilometres and is capable of significant trajectory changes during flight to evade defence systems.

Sammy Basso dies at the age of 28






