### **WJP Rule of Law Index Published**


India ranks 98th out of 142 countries in the World Justice Project (WJP) Rule of Law Index, while Pakistan is placed at a dismal 140th, making it the third worst globally for order and security, with only Mali and Nigeria ranked lower. Denmark leads the index, followed by Norway, Finland, Sweden, and Germany. The WJP report assesses nations based on various factors, including governance, corruption, and justice systems.

# New Cargo Gate Boosts India-Bangladesh Trade

Union Home Minister Amit Shah inaugurated a new passenger terminal and the 'Maitri Dwar' cargo gate at the Petrapole Land Port on the India-Bangladesh border today. This terminal, the largest in South Asia, aims to enhance international trade and facilitate crossings, handling 20,000 passengers daily. The Petrapole-Benapole crossing accounts for nearly 70% of land trade between the two countries. Shah will attend additional events in Hooghly and Kolkata.

## Rare Asiatic Golden Cat Sighted in UNESCO Site

Wildlife experts have reconfirmed the presence of the rare Asiatic golden cat in Assam's Manas National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage site. The International Union for Conservation of Nature lists this medium-sized felid (Catopuma temminckii) as 'Near Threatened' in its Red List. The cat, protected under India's Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972, inhabits diverse ecosystems, from dry deciduous forests to sub-alpine regions, at elevations up to 3,738 metres.

### **India Commemorates Infantry Day**

Infantry Day is being observed across India to honour the Infantry, the largest combat branch of the Indian Army. This day is significant as it commemorates the landing of Indian Army troops at Srinagar airport in 1947, which successfully repelled invaders supported by Pakistan. To celebrate the occasion, Chief of Defence Staff General Anil Chauhan and Chief of Army Staff General Upendra Dwivedi laid wreaths at the National War Memorial in New Delhi.

## New Flowering Plant Discovered in Arunachal Pradesh

Researchers have discovered a new flowering plant, Begonia neisti, in the remote Dibang Valley of Arunachal Pradesh, highlighting the region's unexplored biodiversity. Dr. Nazir Ahmad Bhat and his team from USTM and CSIR-NEIST found the visually striking species with variegated leaves and distinctive stem patterns. Blooming from November to January, the plant's habitat faces threats from road expansion. Classified as Data Deficient by the IUCN, experts call for urgent conservation measures.

### **Global Nature Conservation Index Released**

India has been ranked 176th out of 180 countries in the 2024 Global Nature Conservation Index, scoring just 45.5 out of 100. This places India among the five worst performers, alongside Kiribati, Turkey, Iraq, and Micronesia. The NCI, launched by Ben-Gurion University and BioDB.com, evaluates conservation efforts based on land management, biodiversity threats, governance, and future trends, aiming to guide improvements in conservation policies and biodiversity protection.



## CJI Highlights Need for Nemaline Myopathy Awareness

Chief Justice of India DY Chandrachud underscored the insufficient awareness of nemaline myopathy during a national consultation focused on children's rights. He shared insights from his experiences with his foster daughters' genetic condition, describing it as a rare congenital disorder that weakens skeletal muscles and impacts mobility. The 9th Annual National Consultation, hosted by the Supreme Court's Juvenile Justice Committee, called for greater awareness and enhanced support systems for children affected by this condition.

## **Historic Achievement at WTT Champions**

Manika Batra made history as the first Indian table tennis player to reach the top eight at the WTT Champions Montpellier 2024 tournament in France, but she lost 3-0 to China's Qian Tianyi in the quarter-finals. Ranked 30th globally, Batra advanced to the quarters by upsetting world No. 14 Bernadette Szocs 3-1, having previously defeated her 3-0 during the Paris 2024 Olympics. Batra struggled against Tianyi, who recently beat world No. 4 Wang Yidi.
