Negro River drops to its lowest levels in 122 years

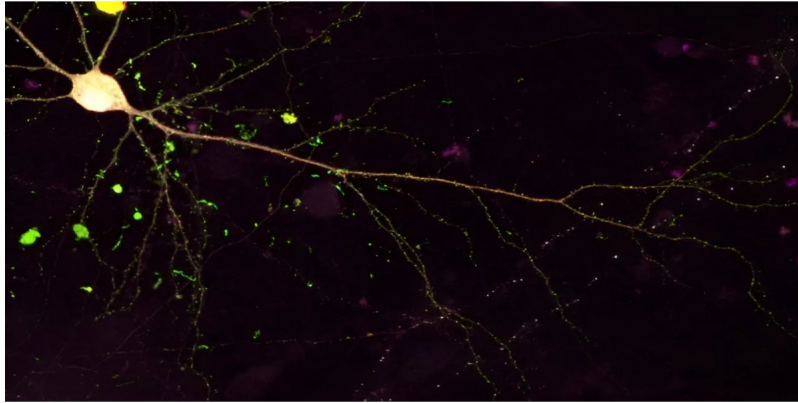

DNA molecules with Invisibility Cloak sequences

Researchers at the Francis Crick Institute have created DNA molecules that incorporate sequences resembling an Invisibility Cloak. These sequences can selectively target diseased cells in Motor neuron disease (MND). MND also known as Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS) and Lou Gehrig's disease is a rare condition that progressively damages parts of the nervous system. MND is caused by a combination of environmental, lifestyle and genetic factors.

A new species of Potter Wasp discovered

Entomologists from ATREE have recently discovered a new species of Potter Wasp namely *Pseumenes Siangensis* from the Eastern Himalayas in Arunachal Pradesh. The species belongs to the genus *Pseumenes* and subfamily Eumeninae. The species is distributed across the Oriental Region and is named after Siang Valley where it was first discovered. The species play a critical role in controlling pest populations.

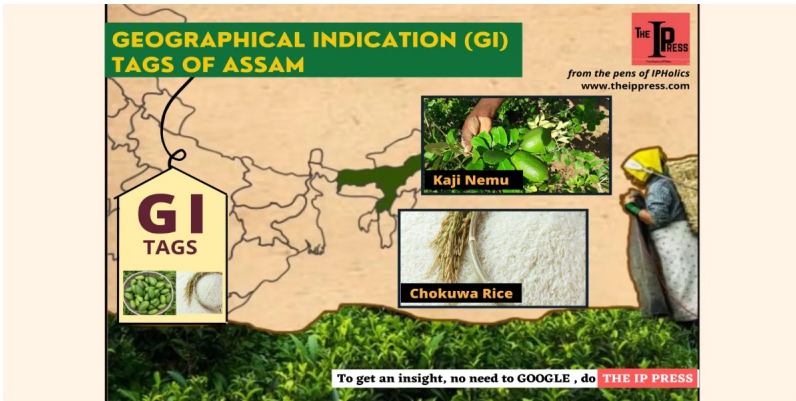

Carbon dioxide Oxide was discovered on Pluto's largest moon Charon

Scientists at Southwest Research Institute, US have recently discovered gases like Carbon dioxide and Hydrogen Peroxide on Pluto's largest moon Charon. Pluto has 5 moons of which Charon is the largest with half the size of Pluto. Charon was discovered in 1978 by James W. Christy and Robert S. Harrington at the US Naval Observatory in Flagstaff, Arizona. It completes an orbit around Pluto approximately every 6.4 Earth days.

Nine captive-bred Pygmy Hogs released in Manas National Park

A total of 9 bred Captive Pygmy Hogs were recently released in Assam's Manas National Park. It is the smallest and rarest species of wild pig in the world and it is also an indicator species as its presence reflects the health of its primary habitat, tall and wet grasslands. Its IUCN status is Critically Endangered and is protected under Schedule 1 of the Wildlife Protection Act, 1972.

Mumbai lifts Irani Cup after 27 years

Mumbai beats the Rest of India by virtue of first innings lead to lift the Irani Cup after 27 years in Lucknow. Ajinkya Rahane led Mumbai with a first-innings lead of 121 runs scoring a total of 537 runs. The Rest of India was led by Captain Abhimanyu Easwaran. It is Mumbai's 15th Irani Cup title and first since 1997.
