## CP Radhakrishnan Becomes India's 15th Vice President

On 9 September 2025, CP Radhakrishnan, former Maharashtra Governor and NDA nominee, was elected as India's 15th Vice President. He secured 452 votes, defeating the INDIA bloc's B. Sudershan Reddy, who received 300, while 15 votes were invalid and 13 members abstained. The election followed the resignation of Jagdeep Dhankhar in July due to health issues. As Vice President, Radhakrishnan will serve as Chairperson of the Rajya Sabha and act as President if the need arises.

## India Secure Bronze Medal in CAFA Nations Cup 2025

In their debut appearance at the CAFA Nations Cup, India made history by clinching the bronze medal with a dramatic 3-2 win on penalties over higher-ranked Oman after a 1-1 draw in regulation and extra time. Udanta Singh's equaliser in the 80th minute pushed the contest to a shootout, where Gurpreet Singh Sandhu's crucial final save secured the podium finish. This landmark result highlights India's growing resilience and tactical maturity on the international stage.



## India's Literacy Rate Reaches 80.9% in 2023–24

India's literacy rate has climbed from 74% in 2011 to 80.9% in 2023–24, reflecting substantial progress in education. This improvement is credited to the ULLAS–Nav Bharat Saaksharta Karyakram, which has enrolled over 3 crore learners and achieved a 90% success rate in foundational literacy and numeracy assessments. However, this national average hides significant disparities: urban literacy stands at around 88.9%, rural at 77.5%, with male literacy higher than female. Certain states and Union Territories continue to lag behind.

## Nepal PM KP Sharma Oli Steps Down Amid Political Turmoil

On 9 September 2025, Nepal's Prime Minister K.P. Sharma Oli resigned amid violent nationwide protests—some of the deadliest in decades. The unrest was sparked by his government's attempt to ban major social media platforms, inciting Gen Z-led anger over censorship, corruption, and economic frustrations. Demonstrations escalated, leaving at least 19 dead and triggering widespread arson, including attacks on government buildings and Oli's own residence. Following mounting pressure, Oli stepped down, and the capital remains under curfew as the country faces deep political instability.

## Army Carries Out Operation Rahat, Saves 6,000 in Flood-Hit Northern States

Since 26 August 2025, the Indian Army's Western Command has led Operation Rahat, a large-scale humanitarian relief mission across Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, and Jammu and Kashmir. The operation included 82 missions executed by 59 Army columns and 17 engineering task forces, rescuing over 6,000 people—including around 300 paramilitary members. More than 13,000 individuals received medical attention, and essential supplies like potable water, medicine, and 48 tonnes of food rations were delivered via air drops and ground convoys to flood-impacted communities.

## Youngest Grandmaster Abhimanyu Mishra Defeats World Champion Gukesh

On 8 September 2025, 16-year-old American grandmaster Abhimanyu Mishra achieved a historic feat by defeating reigning World Chess Champion Gukesh Dommaraju in the fifth round of the FIDE Grand Swiss tournament held in Samarkand, Uzbekistan. The intense classical game lasted 61 moves and made Mishra the youngest player ever to beat a sitting world champion. This remarkable victory adds to his earlier record as the youngest-ever grandmaster and underscores his meteoric rise in the chess world.

## India and Israel Sign Bilateral Investment Pact

India and Israel have signed a landmark bilateral investment agreement to deepen their economic engagement. Israel becomes the first OECD country to enter into such a "strategic agreement" under India's updated investment treaty model. The pact offers enhanced investor protection, arbitration frameworks, and mechanisms to ensure smooth capital transfers and compensation for losses. Valued against a backdrop of nearly USD 800 million in existing bilateral investments, the agreement is expected to foster increased trade, mutual investments, and pave the way for broader strategic economic cooperation.
