Angikaar 2025: Accelerating Urban Housing for All

Launched on 4th September 2025, Angikaar 2025 is a two-month national campaign to promote PMAY-U 2.0 in over 5,000 urban areas. Spearheaded by Union Minister Shri Manohar Lal, the campaign aims to enhance awareness, expedite house completions, and ensure delivery to eligible urban beneficiaries. Through door-to-door outreach, events, and loan melas, it promotes convergence with related schemes, empowering vulnerable groups and fostering public participation. The goal is to enroll one crore families and strengthen the mission of Housing for All.

Anutin Charnvirakul Rises Amid Thailand's Political Shift

On September 5, 2025, Anutin Charnvirakul of the Bhumjaithai Party was elected Thailand's Prime Minister with 63% of the parliamentary vote, defeating Pheu Thai's Chaikasem Nitisiri. His election marks a turning point in Thai politics, signaling the decline of Thaksin Shinawatra's influence. A former health and interior minister, Anutin led Thailand's COVID-19 response and cannabis reform. Backed by the People's Party in a tactical alliance, he pledged constitutional reform and early elections, bridging political divides with strategic pragmatism.

Tuticorin Port Powers Ahead with Green Hydrogen Launch

On the birth anniversary of V.O. Chidambaranar, Union Minister Sarbananda Sonowal officially launched a green hydrogen pilot plant along with important infrastructure projects at Tuticorin Port in Tamil Nadu. The event marked a major leap toward clean energy and sustainable maritime growth. Projects included a 6 MW wind power unit, 110 kV substation, and the 10th container terminal. These developments align with the National Green Hydrogen Mission, reinforcing India's ambition to become a global green hydrogen hub while modernizing port operations under the Sagarmala initiative.

DRDO Hands Over Defence-Grade Materials to Industry

DRDO transferred three critical defence materials technologies to Indian industries, advancing the Atmanirbhar Bharat mission. Developed by DMRL, Hyderabad, the tech includes radomes for missiles (to BHEL), DMR-1700 steel for defence systems (to JSPL), and DMR 249A HSLA steel for naval shipbuilding (to SAIL). These transfers boost indigenous production, reduce import reliance, and empower public-private collaboration. An MoU with AAIB was also signed to enhance aviation safety using metallurgical expertise.

Royal Bhutan Buddhist Temple Opens in Rajgir, Bihar

In September 2025, Bhutan's PM Tshering Tobgay and India's Kiren Rijiju inaugurated the Royal Bhutan Buddhist Temple in Rajgir, Bihar, a city deeply linked to Lord Buddha's life. The temple enhances cultural connections between India and Bhutan while boosting Rajgir's significance as an important spiritual center for Buddhism. Conducted with Bhutanese rituals, the event highlighted shared Buddhist heritage, promoting religious diplomacy, regional tourism, and cross-border cultural exchange, while symbolizing the deep-rooted spiritual bond between the two Himalayan neighbors.

ISRO's Kulasekarapattinam Spaceport Targets 2026 Launches

ISRO's second launch facility in Kulasekarapattinam, Tamil Nadu, is expected to become operational by December 2026. Covering 2,300 acres, this spaceport is designed specifically for Small Satellite Launch Vehicles (SSLVs) and will support up to 25 launches per year, significantly increasing India's satellite launch capabilities. Its coastal location supports direct polar orbit launches, ideal for Earth observation missions. The project, inaugurated by PM Modi in 2024, will boost local employment, aerospace growth, and India's capacity for cost-effective, high-frequency satellite deployment.

RBI Approves R Gandhi's Return as Yes Bank Chairman

The Reserve Bank of India has extended R Gandhi's tenure as the non-executive chairman of Yes Bank, appointing him for the period from September 2025 to May 2027. Gandhi, a former RBI Deputy Governor, brings over 37 years of banking expertise, including regulatory and capital markets experience. His leadership continuity supports Yes Bank's recovery, enhances governance, and strengthens regulatory compliance during this critical phase, though he will not engage in daily management.

Singapore Backs India's Malacca Strait Patrol Initiative

Singapore has endorsed India's plan to patrol the strategic Malacca Strait, strengthening maritime security in the Indo-Pacific. Announced during PM Lawrence Wong's 2025 India visit, this support enhances regional surveillance and counters Chinese naval influence. The two nations also agreed on five pacts spanning green energy, defence, and emerging tech like AI and quantum computing. The Malacca Strait remains vital for global trade, linking the Indian Ocean and South China Sea, making this cooperation crucial for regional stability.

India Launches First Vulture Knowledge Portal in Assam

Launched on International Vulture Awareness Day, the initiative highlights urgent threats like poisoning and habitat loss, especially for critically endangered species like the Slender-billed Vulture, and stresses the importance of community-led conservation and informed policymaking.

India Develops High-Purity Drug Marker to Fight Doping

India has developed a unique, high-purity Reference Material (RM) — Methandienone Long-Term Metabolite (LTM) — to bolster its anti-doping measures. Created by NIPER and the National Dope Testing Laboratory (NDTL), this RM enables precise detection of banned anabolic steroids. It strengthens testing for over 450 WADA-prohibited substances and deters doping in sports. This advancement promotes fair play and athlete integrity. NDTL, India's only WADA-accredited dope testing lab, leads this initiative with global testing standards.
