## 2. International Master (IM) Title

The IM title, the second-highest in chess, requires a male player to achieve a FIDE Elo rating of 2400 and three IM norms. For women, the requirement is a 2200 Elo rating and three Women International Master norms.

## 3. Other Titles: FIDE Master and Candidate Master

The FIDE Master title is awarded to players who reach a FIDE Elo rating of 2300 (2200 for women) without the need for norms. The Candidate Master title requires a rating of 2200 for men and 2100 for women.
