









Strengthening India-Singapore Ties at the 2nd Ministerial Roundtable



Historical Context: Evolution of India-Singapore Relations

The bilateral trade between India and Singapore has grown significantly over the years. From a modest 6.7billionin2004-05, itreached30.11 billion in 2021-22, with Singapore emerging as India's sixth-largest trade partner. Singapore also plays a pivotal role as the largest source of foreign direct investment (FDI) into India, with cumulative FDI inflows amounting to \$159.94 billion from April 2000 to March 2024. These numbers highlight the growing interdependence between the two economies.

Focus Areas of the 2nd ISMR: Expanding Horizons

The 2nd ISMR focused on six pillars: digitalisation, skill development, sustainability, healthcare and medicine, advanced manufacturing, and connectivity. These areas were chosen not only because of their relevance to the ongoing global shifts in technology and economics but also due to their potential for mutual growth.






Strengthening India-Singapore Ties at the 2nd Ministerial Roundtable
