Common Conjunctions: *Because, Since, While, However, Therefore, Although, Even, Or, Nor, But*

- **Prepositions:** Prepositions are words that show the relationship between a noun or pronoun and other words in a sentence. They indicate location, direction, time, or manner.

Common Prepositions: *Of, By, With, On, In, At, For, Over, Under, Between*

- **Articles:** Articles are used to indicate whether a noun is specific or nonspecific. English has these articles: "**the**" (definite article) and "**a**" or "**an**" (indefinite articles).

- **Determiners:** Determiners are words that introduce or specify nouns.

Common Determiners: *This, Some, Many, Few, Each, Every, Both, All, Any, Several*

- **Interjections:** Interjections are words or phrases used to express strong emotions, often appearing in exclamatory sentences.

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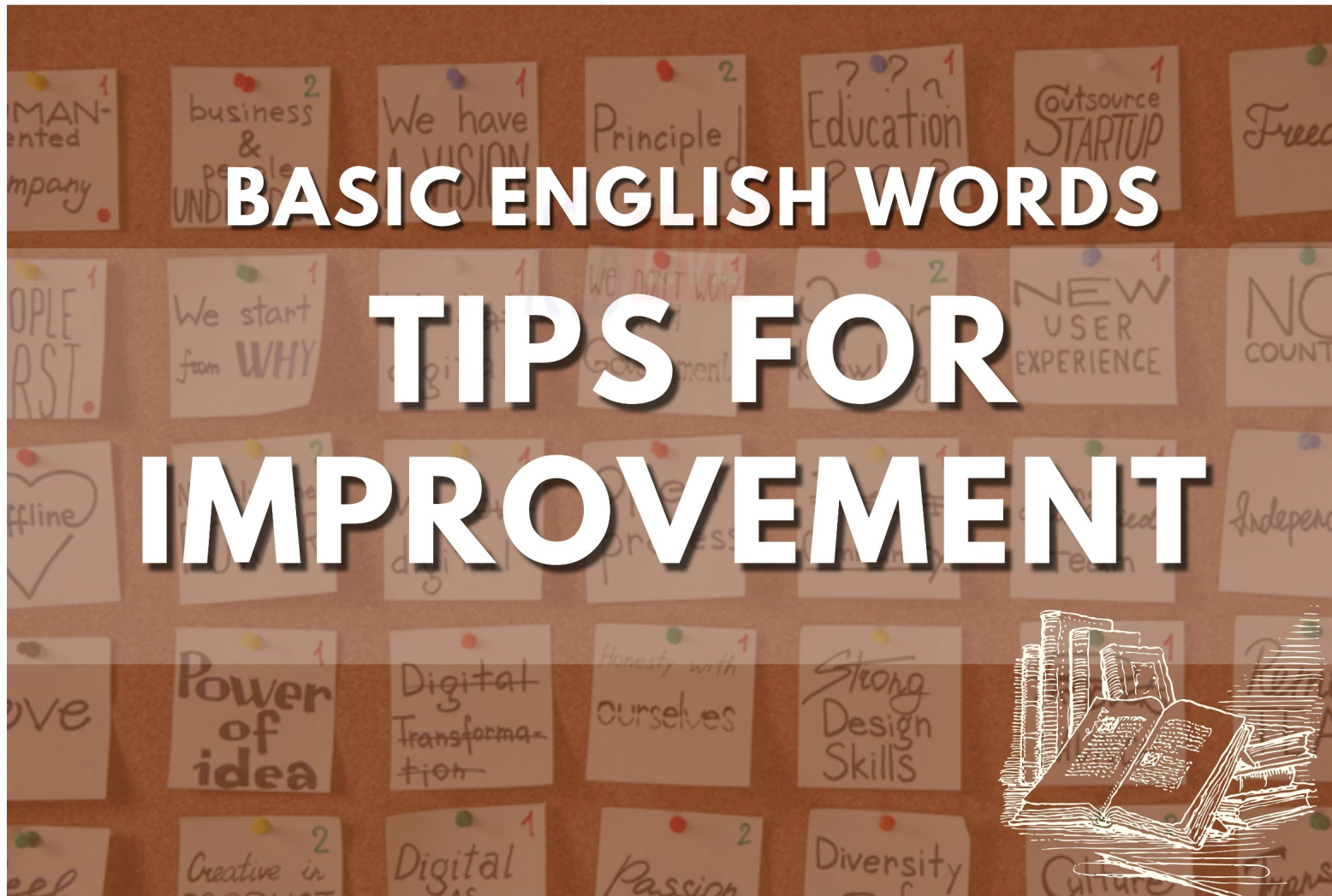
Common Interjections: *Wow, Oops, Yay, Oh no, Hooray, Phew, Huh, Shh, Ouch, Hey*
