







· Benevolent (adjective) - characterized by kindness and goodwill

• Capitulate (verb) - to surrender or give in under certain conditions

• Debilitate (verb) - to weaken or make feeble

**Usage:** The illness debilitated her to the point that she could hardly get out of bed.

• Effervescent (adjective) - bubbly and enthusiastic

**Usage:** Her effervescent personality always brightened the room.

• Frenetic (adjective) - fast-paced and chaotic

**Usage:** The frenetic pace of the city can be overwhelming for some.

• Garrulous (adjective) - excessively talkative

**Usage:** Her garrulous nature made it challenging to have a quiet conversation.

· Iconoclast (noun) - a person who challenges established beliefs or traditions

**Usage:** He was seen as an iconoclast for advocating unconventional solutions to societal problems.

• Juxtapose (verb) - to place side by side for contrast

**Usage:** The artist juxtaposed light and dark elements in her painting to create a striking effect.

· Kindle (verb) - to ignite or inspire

**Usage:** His words kindled a passion for learning in the students.

• Lethargy (noun) - a state of sluggishness and lack of energy

**Usage:** After a long day at work, she succumbed to lethargy and spent the evening on the couch.

• **Nebulous** (adjective) - unclear or vague

Usage: The instructions for the project were so nebulous that no one knew where to start.

• Ostracize (verb) - to exclude or banish someone from a group

**Usage:** He was ostracized from the team after his unethical behavior came to light.

• Paradox (noun) - a statement that seems contradictory but may be true

• Yearn (verb) - to have a strong desire or longing for something

**Usage:** She yearned for a chance to travel and explore new cultures.

• Zealot (noun) - a person who is fanatically devoted to a cause or belief

Usage: The environmental zealot was dedicated to protecting the planet at all costs.
