Q:1 The synonym of **Libidinous** is **Promiscuous** i.e., **Option 1**.

Libidinous Meaning: showing excessive sexual drive; lustful.

How to use Libidinous in a sentence: His libidinous desires often got him into trouble, as he struggled to control his impulses in social situations.

Promiscuous Meaning: having or characterized by many transient sexual relationships.

How to use Promiscuous in a sentence: Her promiscuous behaviour in college earned her a reputation for casual and frequent sexual encounters, but she later realized the importance of forming meaningful connections in relationships.

Antonyms of Libidinous: Chaste, Pure, Modest, Prudish, Virtuous

Meanings of the other options

Chaste: abstaining from extramarital, or from all, sexual intercourse.

Celibate: abstaining from marriage and sexual relations, typically for religious reasons.

Abstinence: refraining from an activity or from the consumption of something, especially alcohol.

Loath Meaning: reluctant; unwilling.

How to use Loath in a sentence: She was loath to attend the long and tedious meeting, as she had other pressing tasks she'd rather be working on.

Antonyms of Loath: Eager, Willing, Enthusiastic, Keen, Ready

Meanings of the other options

Willing: ready, eager, or prepared to do something.

Eager: strongly wanting to do or have something.

Fervid: intensely enthusiastic or passionate, especially to an excessive degree.

Q:3 The synonym of **Lascivious** is **Lecherous** i.e., **Option 3.**

Lascivious Meaning: feeling or revealing an overt sexual interest or desire.

How to use Lascivious in a sentence:

His lascivious remarks and suggestive gestures made everyone in the room uncomfortable during the otherwise formal event.

Lecherous Meaning: having or showing excessive or offensive sexual desire.

How to use Lecherous in a sentence: The lecherous old man would often make inappropriate advances toward younger women, making them feel uneasy in his presence.

Antonyms of Lascivious: Chaste, Modest, Virtuous, Pure, Decent

Meanings of the other options

Puritanical: having or displaying a very strict or censorious moral attitude towards self-indulgence or sex.

Ascetic: characterized by severe self-discipline and abstention from all forms of indulgence, typically for religious reasons.

Priggish: self-righteously moralistic and superior.

Q:4 The synonym of **Licentious** is **Debauched** i.e., **Option 2.**

Licentious Meaning: promiscuous and unprincipled in sexual matters.

Ethical: relating to moral principles or the branch of knowledge dealing with these.

Antonyms of Livid: Calm, Serene, Composed, Peaceful, Tranquil

Meanings of the other options

Flushed: (of a person's skin) red and hot, typically as the result of illness or strong emotion.

Tranquil: free from disturbance; calm.

Serene: calm, peaceful, and untroubled; tranquil.

Q:6 The antonym of **Levy** is **Disband** i.e., **Option 4**.

Levy Meaning: impose

How to use Levy in a sentence: The government decided to levy a new tax on luxury cars to generate revenue for public infrastructure projects.

Disband Meaning: break up or cause to break up

How to use Disband in a sentence: After completing their mission, the special forces unit decided to disband and return to their respective home countries.

Synonyms of Levy: Tax, Charge, Imposition, Assessment, Collection

Meanings of the other options

Mulct: extract money from (someone) by fine or taxation.

Impose: force (an unwelcome decision or ruling) on someone.

Charge: demand (an amount) as a price for a service rendered or goods supplied.

Q:7 The antonym of **Languid** is **Vigorous** i.e., **Option 4**.

Languid Meaning: weak or faint from illness or fatigue.

How to use Languid in a sentence: After a long day at work, she felt so languid that she could barely muster the energy to make dinner, opting instead to relax on the couch.

Vigorous Meaning: strong, healthy, and full of energy.

How to use Vigorous in a sentence: Despite his age, he remained vigorous and active, participating in regular exercise and outdoor activities to maintain his health and vitality.

Synonyms of Languid: Listless, Lethargic, Sluggish, Apathetic, Indolent

Meanings of the other options

Enervated: to reduce the mental or moral vigour of.

Fatigue: an overall feeling of tiredness or lack of energy.

Weary: feeling or showing extreme tiredness, especially as a result of excessive exertion.

Q:8 The antonym of **Lethargic** is **Vigorous** i.e., **Option 4**.

Lethargic Meaning: affected by lethargy; sluggish and apathetic.

How to use Lethargic in a sentence: After a heavy meal, he often felt lethargic and had trouble staying awake during the afternoon meetings.

Vigorous Meaning: strong, healthy, and full of energy.

How to use Vigorous in a sentence: She embarked on a vigorous exercise routine to improve her fitness and boost her overall energy levels.

Synonyms of Lethargic: Sluggish, Listless, Drowsy, Inactive, Tired

Meanings of the other options

Sluggish: slow-moving or inactive.

Lexicon Meaning: the vocabulary of a person, language, or branch of knowledge.

Meanings of the other options

Glossary: an alphabetical list of words relating to a specific subject, text, or dialect, with explanations; a brief dictionary.

Thesaurus: a book or electronic resource that lists words in groups of synonyms and related concepts.

Concordance: an alphabetical list of the words (especially the important ones) present in a text, usually with citations of the passages in which they are found.

Q:10 The antonym of **Lust** is **Chastity** i.e., **Option 4**.

Lust Meaning: strong sexual desire.

How to use Lust in a sentence: His lust for sex was insatiable, driving him to pursue it at any cost, even if it meant betraying those closest to him.

Chastity Meaning: the state or practice of refraining from extramarital, or especially from all, sexual intercourse.

How to use Chastity in a sentence: Her commitment to chastity meant she chose to abstain from all sexual activity until marriage.

Synonyms of Lust: Desire, Passion, Craving, Longing, Appetite

Ardour: great enthusiasm or passion.

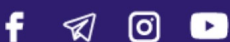
