Antonyms of Wanderlust: Homebody, Stay-at-home, Sedentary, Settled, Rooted

Meanings of the other options

Contentment: a state of happiness and satisfaction with one's life and circumstances.

Satisfaction: the feeling of pleasure or fulfillment that comes after achieving a goal or desire.

Ambivalence: having mixed or contradictory feelings or attitudes towards something.

Swim: to move through water by moving your arms and legs

Synonyms of Warren: Castle, Palace, Manor, Burrow, Colony
