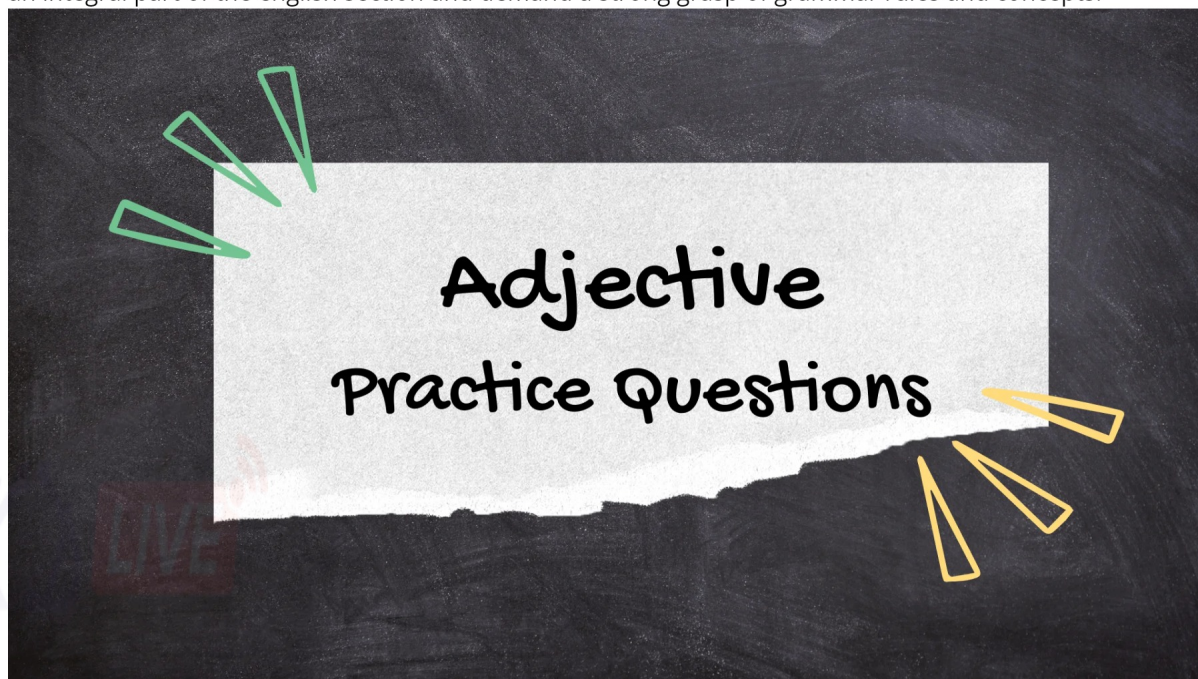

### Solutions of Easy Level Adjective Questions

**Q:1 (3)** The use of the adjective 'later' is incorrect as here we are referring to a position particularly something occurring near the end as in this case and not to the time. We have to replace, the word '**later**' with '**latter**'. For 'time', we use 'later' but for 'position', we use '**latter**'.

**Q:2 (3)** In the given sentence the error lies in **part C** with the incorrect usage of comparative adjective 'higher'. Its correct degree will be superlative i.e. '**highest**'.

**Q:3 (1)** Here, it appears that the changes have been made earlier. It means it indicates a past action. Therefore, it should be 'last year', not 'next year'.

**Q:4 (3)** The above sentence talks about the starting of a special court. The word 'fast-track' occur together. That is why 'fast' is the correct filler for the blank.

**Q:5 (1)** The presence of "easy" is inappropriate here in the context of the statement. Instead of the word "easy", "vital" will suit in here by making the sentence meaningful.

**Q:6 (3)** The sentence will seem contextually appropriate with the application of "a few" in it as the presence of "a smaller number" is irrelevant here. In order to present plural nouns and a plural verb to mean not many, we use "a few" in a sentence. Here, "a few" makes the sentence seem grammatically appropriate.

**Q:7 (4)** '**Dense**' means completely covered or opaque, which is incontextual. '**Commendatory**' means favourable, which is also absurd here because the word '**Even**' indicates a contradictory situation here. '**Inept**' means unskillful, which is irrelevant to the context. '**Difficult**' clearly suits the context as it justifies the contradiction of Tata motor's good performance in spite of bad time for the industry.

**Q:8 (5)** "Holy" seems to be the correct answer here. The statement seems to provide inferences on Ganga that it is a "**Holy**" river in Hindu mythology and it is stating about the religious festivals that it entails.

**Q:9 (2)** Because fraud and misconduct can occur at various levels in any organization, it is essential that appropriate preventive and detective techniques are in place. So, the two correct words will be "One-Any" which will make the statement seem coherent.

**Q:10 (2)** The blank requires a word that best replicates the sentence's denotation and the word "**acute**" fits best in here as it means '**very serious; very great**'.

### Solutions of Moderate Level Adjective Questions

**Q:1 (1)** As the word 'concern' is a noun, we need an adjective to modify it. So, the adjective '**significant**' is the correct usage as it means 'sufficiently great or important to be worthy of attention; noteworthy.'

**Q:2 (2)** When **nouns act as adjectives** using a hyphen, they are not used with apostrophes or in plural forms.

**Q:3 (1)** '**Comprehensive**' is the most appropriate word to be used which means 'including or dealing with all or nearly all elements or aspects of something.'

**Q:4 (4)** 'India' is a singular nonliving thing. Therefore, the possessive adjective to it must be '**its**' and **not 'their'**.'

**Q:6 (4)** The statement seems to be providing inferences on India to be getting a real-time "**access**" to American geospatial intelligence that will enhance the accuracy of automated systems and weapons like missiles and armed drones with the help of BECA. So, the word "**Access**" will fit the best here by providing accurate meaning to the statement.

**Q:7 (1)** The above sentence talks about the adoption and manufacturing of Hybrid and Electric Vehicles. The word that seems to be the correct fit is '**conscious**' as it means 'being aware of and responding to one's surroundings.'

**Q:8 (1)** Railways are authority and have made it mandatory/ compulsory to carry identity proof with it.

**Q:9 (3)** The statement depicts that India is still a cash economy but if anything managed to chip away at that, even if just slightly, it has been the rapidly innovating **digital** wallets industry. So, the two correct words will be "a-Digital" which will make the statement seem coherent. The remaining options are not in congruency with the given statement.

**Q:10 (2)** The words that fit best in the sentence are "**adequate, urgent**" as they are the only ones that suit the sentence (grammatically as well as contextually). The above sentence talks about ensuring the bank's regulations, so, 'adequate' means satisfactory or acceptable in quality or quantity

### Solutions of Hard Level Adjective Questions

**Q:1 (1)** It is observed that both the ordinal and cardinal numbers are in use i.e. both three and first are there. In such a scenario, the ordinal should always precede the cardinal number used. So, first three lucky winners would have been the correct usage.

**Q:2 (3)** Replace 'older' by 'elderly'. We use the adjectives 'elder' and 'eldest' before a noun as attributive adjectives. Adjectives in the first position - before the noun - are called Attributive adjectives. Those in the second position - after the noun - are called Predicative adjectives. Predicative adjectives do not occur immediately after the noun. Instead, 32 they follow a verb. We use older and oldest after a linking verb (as predicative adjectives).

**Q:3 (3)** Pleonastic is an adjective which means the use of more words than are necessary to express an idea; redundancy. 'Over' as an adverb implies 'used to express action and result', which is incorrect. So, option I can't be used.

Option II can't be used due to incorrect positioning of the adverb.

'Overly' is an adverb that implies 'excessively', which is coherent with the given context. 'Without being overly pleonastic' makes the sentence grammatically correct and coherent.

**Q:4 (2)** The most suitable word for the blank is '**Blistering**' which means intense.

**Jeopardize:** put (someone or something) into a situation in which there is a danger of loss, harm, or failure.

**Defective:** imperfect or faulty.

**Convenient:** fitting in well with a person's needs, activities, and plans.

**Q:5 (5)** The statement talks about a company's secret policies. The word '**confidential**' means 'secret; not to be shown or told to other people' best fits the statement.

**Q:6 (3)** The first blank refers to what should be done through "public taxes" and hence, "funding", "**financing**" may fit the first blank. For the second blank, the appropriate word should be something that fits with the overall theme of eliminating the problem of exclusion. Hence, only "universal" meaning 'widespread or collective' fits the second blank.

**Q:7 (3)** There is only one word that makes sense in this context for all the three given blanks and that is '**derogatory**' which means 'showing a critical or disrespectful attitude'.

**Q:8 (4)** The most suitable option that fits in the blanks making complete sense as per the sentence is - statutory, cognizable.

**Q:9 (1)** The words that fit best in the sentence are "**Extensive, Informal**". The word '**extensive**' means 'covering or affecting a large area' and the word '**informal**' means 'having a relaxed, friendly, or unofficial style, manner, or nature.'

**Q:10 (1)** Among the given options, we can only choose '**candid**' to fit in all the three given blanks since all the other words are unfit for all the three blanks at the same time. The word '**candid**' means 'truthful and straightforward; frank'.
