Noun - Definition

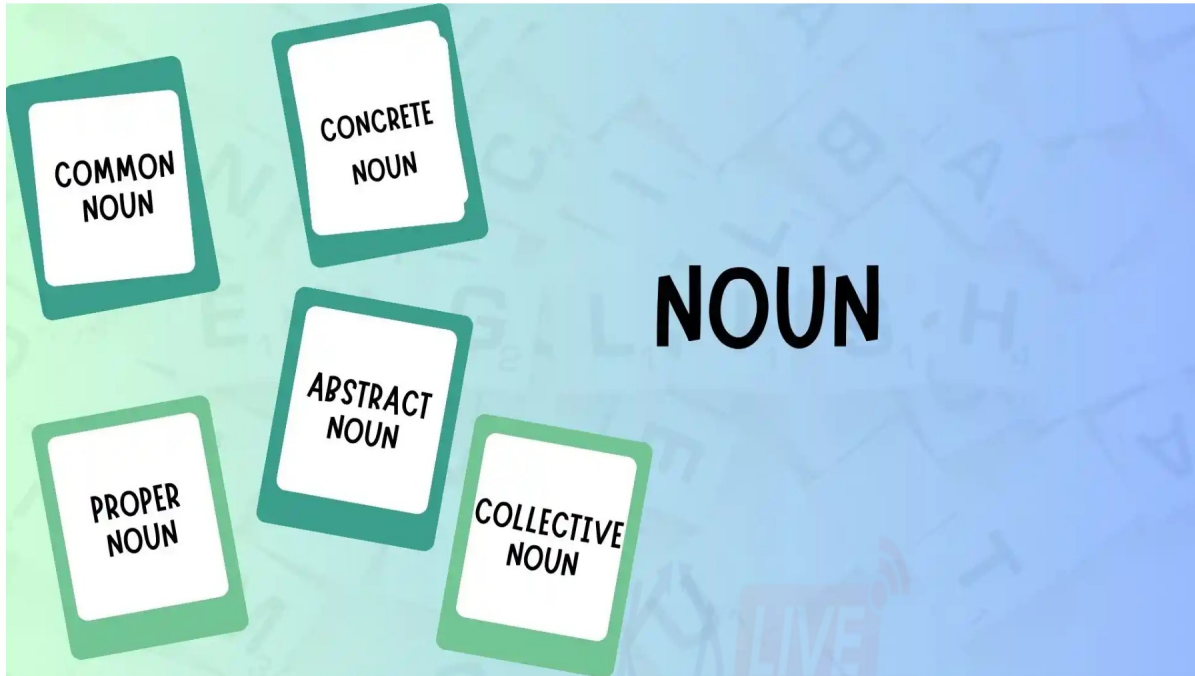

COMMON NOUN

A common noun is the general, non-specific name for a person, place, or thing in a class or group. Unlike proper nouns, a common noun is not capitalized unless it either begins a sentence or appears in a title. Some examples of common noun used in sentences:

My favorite newspaper is the Times Post.

The dog chased its tail in the backyard.

I need to buy some fresh vegetables for dinner.

She wore a beautiful dress to the party.

The car stopped at the red traffic light.

PROPER NOUN

Proper nouns, on the other hand, are specific and always capitalized. They identify unique people, places, or things. "Sam," "New Delhi," and "Hari" are examples of proper nouns. Some examples of proper noun in sentences:

John (proper noun) is eating a mango.

My dog's name is Brownie.

India is a beautiful country.

CONCRETE NOUNS

Concrete nouns refer to tangible, physical objects that can be perceived by the five senses. Examples include "table," "rose," and "chocolate."

There are many new laptops launched last month.

ABSTRACT NOUN

Abstract nouns represent concepts, emotions, or qualities that are not tangible. Examples include "love," "freedom," and "happiness." Some examples of abstract noun in sentences:

Family is important to me

Love is the most powerful force in the world.

Honesty is always the best policy.

Courage is the ability to face fear and danger.

COLLECTIVE NOUN

Collective nouns refer to groups or collections of things or people. They are singular in form but represent a collective entity. Examples include "team," "herd," and "family."

Collective Noun examples in sentences:

The herd of cows was grazing in the field.

The pack of wolves howled at the moon.

The flock of birds flew in formation.

The school of fish swam in circles.

The pride of lions was on the hunt.
