Solutions of Easy Level Preposition Questions

Q:1 (3) To when followed by a Verb makes it an 'infinitive verb'. Here, it will be always followed by Verb in its 1st form only. Q:2 (3) Statement "D" seems to have an error with the application of "mission on 1969". Instead of "on", it should be "in". 'In' is a preposition, commonly used to show a situation when something is enclosed or surrounded by something else. 'On' refers to a preposition that expresses a situation when something is positioned above something else.

Q:3 (4) The presence of "for" in the statement is inappropriate. "For" is used when talking about the past, present or future and with consideration to the given sentence, this seems irrelevant. "Against" is used to refer to negative, hostile or opposing reactions to situations, beliefs, people, events, etc.

Q:4 (2) In sentence A, 'pass the deer' is an incorrect phrase. The correct phrase is 'pass the buck' which means 'shifting the responsibility for something to someone else'. In sentence C, the preposition has been incorrectly used. 'Between' is used when referring to two things. But in the context of the given sentence, it involves more than two things which makes 'among' the correct preposition.

Q:5 (1) The preposition "on" is incorrect. It should be "in".

In - Use in when something is located inside of a defined space.

On - Use **on** when something is touching the surface of something.

Q:6 (1) The preposition "at" used in part A is incorrect. It should be changed to 'in', as the sentence is talking about the the students those are residing in different countries.

Q:7 (2) The preposition "in" is incorrect here. It should be "to". Correct phrase is 'to declare'.

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Q:8 (2) The preposition 'in' needs to be replaced with 'of'. 'Of' is used in the sense of belonging to somebody; relating to somebody. Here, the mission relates to sending an Indian astronaut.

Q:9 (2) The most appropriate phrase to replace the highlighted phrase to frame a grammatically viable and contextually meaningful sentence is "of knowing the reason".

Q:10 (4) Sentence 'E' seems to have a prepositional error as the word 'on' looks inappropriate in the line. The word that should be used instead, is "with".

Solutions of Moderate Level Preposition Questions

Q:1 (1) Fragment A is erroneous as, it uses 'there', which is incorrect as when a comma is used it is generally followed with 'where'. Fragment C is incorrect as it uses the incorrect preposition "in" it should be replaced by "of".

Q:2 (1) The use of 'as' after 'deemed' is wrong. Either 'deemed' is used with 'to be' or is used directly after adjectives. So, 'as' should be replaced with 'to be' in the given sentence.

Q:3 (4) Statement "C" seems to have an error with the application of "safety about lives" which should be "safety of lives" to make the sentence seem grammatically accurate.

Q:4 (3) The preposition "in" is incorrect. It should be "of", i.e. a strict practice of shared rituals.

Q:5 (2) The preposition "among" is incorrect. It should be "of", i.e. the data of diseases.

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Q:6 (4) The preposition "by" is incorrect. It should be "of". Of is a preposition. iT commonly introduces prepositional phrases which are complements of nouns, creating the pattern: noun + of + noun. This pattern is very common, especially to indicate different parts, pieces, amounts and groups.

Q:7 (3) The preposition "in" in "in the Central level" is incorrect. It should be "at". "At" is used when you are at the top, bottom or end of something; at a specific address; at a general location; and at a point. "In" is used in a space, small vehicle, water, neighborhood, city and country.

Q:8 (3) The phrase "trust and attacks in" is incorrect. The correct phrase is "trust and attacks on".

Q:9 (4) The phrase "sure on the future of journalism" is incorrect. The correct phrase is "sure about the future of journalism".

Q:10 (3) 'Appeal' is the verb which either takes the preposition 'to' or 'against' with respect to the sentence given. Here, in the sentence, 'appeal against' would be used as it is in the context of law and decision. If you appeal to someone to do something, you make a

serious and urgent request to them whereas if you appeal to someone in authority against a decision, you formally ask them to change it. So, we have to replace 'appeal to' with 'appeal against'.

Solutions of Hard Level Preposition Questions

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Q:1 (3) The preposition "in" is incorrect. It should be "about".

Q:2 (4) The preposition "of" is incorrect. It should be "in". Write in means to insert in a document or text.

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Q:3 (2) The preposition "of" is incorrect, it should be "about".

Q:4 (1) The preposition "through" is incorrect. The correct preposition is "by". By and through: The main difference between these two prepositions is, by is mostly used when referring to a means of something while through is used in relation to a process.

Q:5 (1) The phrase says, "numbers in" which is incorrect. The correct preposition that will be used here is "of" in "numbers of".

Q:6 (2) The phrase says "huge blow on" which is incorrect. The correct preposition is "in". Blow in is a pharsal verb of blow which means 'arrive casually and unannounced.'

Q:7 (2) The verb 'discuss' is a transitive verb (a verb that requires one or more objects) and must not be used with a preposition. Therefore, 'discuss about' is incorrect.

Q:8 (5) Option 1: We need to replace 'educating' with 'educate'. The sentence needs to have a parallel structure i.e. 'educate' (base form of the verb) should be used to agree with 'raise' (base form of the verb).

Option 2: We need to replace 'begun' with 'began'. 'Since' as conjunction sometimes combines with 'ever' to make 'ever since'. In this construction, the main clause tense is present perfect tense and the time clause tense is simple past tense.

Option 3: We need to replace 'between' with 'amid'. We use 'between' to refer to two things that are clearly separated. 'Amid' is used when we talk about uncountable things.

Option 4: The adjective "geographical" has been used to describe the verb "constituted" which is incorrect. We need to use the adverb 'geographically' to describe the verb "constituted".

Q:9 (4) Instead of "to", there should be "from" in here in order to make the sentence grammatically as well as contextually meaningful. "From" is suitable here as it is used to mark the beginning and ending point of an action in time.

Q:10 (1) In sentence B, it should be 'employees' instead of 'employee'. In sentence C, replace 'for' with 'to'. 'To' is used for expressing motion in the direction of (a particular location) and used with the base form of a verb to indicate that the verb is in the infinitive, in particular.
