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

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Solutions of Easy Level Pronoun Questions

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Q:1 (1) The error is based on the personal pronoun. In part C, 'its' is used for the parents. Since the noun is plural, it will take a plural pronoun only. Therefore, it should be 'their'.

Q:2 (4) The theme of this paragraph is a record of the highest Internet speed. The first sentence in the paragraph is part 'C' that cites the introductory information of the passage. This sentence is continued in sentence 'D' that cites the detail as to what those researchers did. So, the correct match is C-D.

The second sentence of the paragraph is 'A' that cites the information on the data transmission rate. This sentence is carried forward by sentence 'F' that tells about the translational rate of transmission. So, the correct match is A-F. The sentence 'B' is the last sentence of the paragraph that cites a statement by UCL. This sentence is continued by sentence 'E'. So, the correct match is B-E.

Q:3 (3) Statement "B" seems to be in conjunction with "E" as both seem to be stating about World Humanitarian Day and that it was designated by United Nations. The remaining statements are not in sync with each other.

Q:4 (3) The sentence will appear correctly with the use of "Has" in it. In the present tense, "have" is used for I, you, we, and they and all plural nouns. "Has" is used for he, she, and it, and for all singular nouns.

Q:5 (4) The mistake lies in the incorrect usage of the word 'him'. It should be replaced with 'he'. In the case of comparison between two nominative cases, the pronoun thatis used is also of the nominative case. In the given sentence, there is comparison between two nominative cases, hence, nominative case will be used.

Q:6 (4) The mistake lies in the incorrect usage of the pronoun 'own'. It should be replaced with the reflexive pronoun 'yourself.' The pronoun 'own' should be used to introduce something or someone that belongs or relates to a particular person or thing and to no other and always used after a possessive pronoun like 'my, your, their, etc., and 'yourself' should be used when the object is same as the subject in a sentence. It refers to one person.

Q:7 We will replace 'their' with 'her'. In the sentence, two singular nouns are joined by 'and' which refer to the same person or thing, the pronoun used for them must be 'singular'.

Q:8 (2) 'Them' is used to refer to the object of a clause. Here, 'feed them' should be used instead of 'feed those'. It usually represents the group of people or things that have experienced the action and refers back to two or more people or thing that were mentioned earlier.

Q:9 (1) The use of "I" as the object of the sentence is incorrect. In the given sentence, as "I" is used as the object of the sentence, hence, it should be changed to the objective pronoun "me".

Q:10 (3) The mistake lies in the incorrect usage of the pronoun 'whom'. "Whom" is used when the word it refers to is acting as the direct object of something in the clause it appears.

In the given sentence, rephrasing the overall pronoun would change "whom was driving" to "he was driving." Since "he" is the subject of the condition, the right word here is "who."

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Solutions of Moderate Level Pronoun Ouestions

Q:1 (2) In the given sentence the error lies in part A. The plural noun 'health system' should be used with a plural pronoun. So, 'its' should be replaced by 'their'.

Q:2 (2) All the given sentences apart from sentence B are incorrect.

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In sentence A, the use of 'also' is erroneous, since it says two contradictory things at once. Thus, the most appropriate conjunction to use would be 'vet'.

In sentence C, 'the threats nature are increasing' is erroneous. "towards" should be used to make the sense of the sentence both grammatically and contextually.

In sentence D, the use of the verb "are" is erroneous in nature. Since nature's beauty is singular in nature, we should use the singular verb "is" to make the sentence grammatically sound.

In sentence E, the word minute means very small or minimal. Whereas the sentence demands a word with the meaning of gigantic or enormous.

Q:3 (2) "Every" is incorrect here. It should be "all". We use both 'all' and 'every' to refer to the total number of something. All refers to a complete group. Every refers to each member of a complete group.

Q:4 (2) 'None of' should be used in place of 'neither of' since, 'neither of' is used for 'two' whereas, 'none of' is used for 'more than two'. Q:5 (1) Replace 'has appeared' with "appear" and 'that' with "which".

Q:6 (3) The theme of this paragraph is a cosmic ray that is speculated to be the reason behind one mass extinction. The first sentence in the paragraph is part 'A' that seems to be an introductory line of the passage. This sentence could be completed by part 'D' of column 2 which provides evidence to confirm the scenario. So, the correct match is A-D.

The second sentence of the paragraph is 'B' that cites a new study. This sentence is completed in the sentence 'E' of column 2 that mentions about the study. So, the correct match is B-E.

The third sentence is 'C' that is in continuation of the previous sentence. The sentence that complies with it is 'F'. So, the correct match is C-F.

Q:7 (1) A-E seems to make a meaningful statement after rearrangement. Statement "A" seems to be in conjunction with "E" as both seem to be stating about the Indian economy and lessons taught by the pandemic that the economy needs people as much as the people need the economy. Theremaining statements are not in sync with each other.

Q:8 (2) The phrase given should use the demonstrative pronoun those instead of them.

Option 1 is incorrect due to the usage of 'whom' instead of who. Option 3 is absurd and the word 'because' breaks the flow of the sentence. Option 4 is incorrect as 'have been' is usually used for something that started in the past and has continued up until now.

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Q:9 (4) The word 'which' in the highlighted part is grammatically incorrect as "which" is used to add information to objects, items, people, situations, etc. The suitable word that fits best there is 'that' as "that" is used to indicate a specific object, item, person, condition. The rest of the words are correct and do not need any improvement.

Q:10 (3) The term "ICICI Lombard General Insurance" has been cited as a singular subject in this sentence. So, the verb and other words have to be singular. So, the word 'themselves' is unsuitable in this sentence. The correct word that could improve the sentence is 'itself'.

Solutions of Hard Level Pronoun Questions

Q:1 (3) Charles is driving the car so it is the motion expressed in the sentence. When the motion is expressed towards something then, pronoun 'into' is used. So, it will be 'into the city' instead of 'in the city'.

Q:2 (3) 'However' should be replaced with "howsoever" and 'oneself' should be replaced by "itself".

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Q:3 (1) This part contains an error of the pronoun. The pronoun 'which' is inappropriate in the part 'A' of this sentence because "which" is used to add information to objects, items, people, situations, etc. In this sentence, the pronoun that fits best is 'that' as "That" is used to indicate a specific object, item, person, condition, etc.

Q:4 (4) The word "there" seems to make the entire sentence grammatically as well as contextually wrong. Part 4 seems to be making a contextual mistake in which the word "there" provides another meaning which is not corresponding to the entire sentence hence this is incorrect and by replacing it with "them" in the sentence will make more grammatical sense out of it as "them" is always used in place of plural nouns or noun groups in the third person whereas "there" is used when the noun is singular.

Q:5 (2) The sentence seems to be inappropriate with the useof "You and I". The sentence has "Except for". 'Except for' is an idiom which means 'if it were not for'. While 'except' is a preposition which means 'apart from' or 'with the exclusion of' and is followed by a personal pronoun in the accusative case (him, me, us, them, etc.), if any. With respect to the used preposition, the most appropriate explanation will be "Except You and me" as it is grammatically appropriate.

Q:6 (3) The mistake lies in the incorrect usage of the pronoun 'his'. It should be replaced with 'her'. When two singular nouns are joined by 'and', preceded by each or every, the pronoun used must be singular and agree in gender with the second noun.

Q:7 (1) The mistake lies in the missing of pronoun 'herself'. 'herself' should be added after 'introduced' After the words - hurt, cheat, prostrate, introduce, present, absent, satisfy, lay; object or reflexive pronoun is used. In the given sentence, the word 'introduced' is used, hence, 'herself' is used as object or reflexive pronoun.

Q:8 (4) The mistake lies in the incorrect usage of the pronoun 'l'. It should be replaced with 'me'. After the word 'let', pronouns are always used in objective case. In the same way, after prepositions like between, except etc, pronouns are always used in objective case. In the given sentence, as let is used, hence, pronoun in objective case will be used i.e., 'l'.

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Q:9 (4) The error lies in part D of the sentence. The mistake lies in the missing pronoun 'myself'. Insert myself after the verb enjoyed. The verb 'enjoy' either takes an object or a reflexive pronoun after it. So, we will use the reflexive pronoun of 'l' i.e. myself. Q:10 (3) The mistake lies in the incorrect usage of the word 'whom'. It should be replaced with 'which'. Here, usage of 'whom' as a pronoun is inappropriate as it is used in context of asking for person. In the given sentence 'which' should replace 'whom' since the sentence talks of things like 'projects' etc.
