- **Q:9 (3)** When used between two nouns that are the same, upon emphasizes the large number or amount of the thing that has been mentioned. Hence, "hell-bent upon getting" is the correct choice.
- **Q:10 (1)** In English, we use "since" to refer to a point of time. In the sentence, it is said that we all are taught that the world is filled with good people who are responsible for a future ambience "**since**" our birth.
