Synonyms and Antonyms are a great way to test one's vocabulary.

Synonyms are words that have the same or similar meanings. Antonyms are words with opposite meanings. In competitive exams like SSC and Banking, vocabulary will help you solve questions on synonyms and antonyms, which can be tricky sometimes.

Some difficult Synonyms and Antonyms are as follows –

Word	Synonym	Antonym
Abstinence = To stop yourself from enjoying something	Temperance, sobriety, chastity, celibacy	Promiscuity, gluttony
Abettor = Someone who assists someone in doing something wrong	Accomplice, advocate, promoter	Antagonist, rival
Crusa <mark>de =</mark> Campaign for change	Drive, movement, struggle, battle	Halt, stoppage, prevent
Shrewd = To show sharp qualities of judgment	Intelligent, alert, clever, smart	Unwise, ingenuous, stupid,
Vindictive = Strong desire for revenge	Revengeful, unforgiving, merciless	Forgiving
Expeditious = Done with speed	Diligent, efficient, punctual	Slow, leisurely, deliberate
Convalesce = To recover after illness	Recuperate, recover	Deteriorate, worsen

But what should you do if you do not know the meaning of the word?

Synonyms and Antonyms : Identify Parts of Speech

Follow this method of **identification** to increase the chances of getting the answer right. You must first identify the given word or the parts of speech. The given words may be any of the following four -

a) Noun – It can be a name, place, a thing, etc.

Eg - Anita, Kolkata, Eraser, etc.

b) Adjective – It can describe the quality of a noun.

Eg - Beautiful, Grand, small, etc.

c) Verb - It can describe an action.

Eg - Run, Swim, Laughing, etc.

d) Adverb – It can describe the quality of a verb.

Eg – Fast, Slowly, Peacefully, etc.

Remember that the synonym or antonym of a noun will always be a noun. Hence, it is important to identify the word first. (Pro-tip: There are very less questions on verb and adverb since these are easier to identify. Mostly, the examiner focuses on noun and adjective)

Synonyms and Antonyms: Tricks to Identify a Noun

Nouns usually end with the following letters -

i) er - Writer, Lover, Leader

ii) or - Director, Corridor, Governor

iii) ty - Honesty, Majesty, Guilty

iv) sion - Mansion, Decision, Television

v) th – Myth, Sixteenth, Aftermath

vi) ment – Government, Disappointment, Regiment

vii) ry – Chivalry, Bravery, Misery, Dictionary

viii) ness - Niceness, Kindness, Gentleness

ix) ce - Performance, Maintenance, Fireplace

x) dom - Boredom, Kingdom, Stardom

xi) ship - Battleship, Friendship xii) lure - Allure, Failure

xiii) ge - Mortgage, Garage

xiv) ics - Physics, Mechanics

xv) ar- Altar, Oscar

Let us take an example – If you are asked to find the synonym or antonym of a word ending in '–ment' and you do not know the meaning of the word. The options are words ending in

- a) -ly (usually an adverb)
- b) -ul (usually not a noun)
- c) -ing (usually a verb)
- d) -sion (a noun)

The best way to solve such questions is to identify the parts of speech. Here, the given word is a noun and hence, the answer would also be a noun. Clearly, the first three options can be eliminated. The last option d) is the safest possible option.

Question - Select the SYNONYM of the given word - 'Pioneer'

- 1. Grumble 2. Facade
- 3. Abandon 4. Primary

Answer – Pioneer means someone <u>among the first</u> to explore, develop, lead, etc. Primary also means the first level, layer, etc. Hence, Primary is the synonym. But if you don't know the meaning of Pioneer, you can follow the identification method. Pioneer is a noun. Hence, synonym must also be a noun. From the list, words ending in –ry is a noun. Hence, 'Primary' is the correct answer. Remember that this is not a 100% effective way to solve Synonym-Antonym questions. Use it only when you are not sure of the word-meaning.

- i) able Commendable, Disable
- ii) al International, Chemical, Magical
- iii) ful Beautiful, Fruitful
- iv) ous Viscous, Continuous
- v) ic Magic, Civic
- vi) ary Customary, Adversary

vii) nent - Permanent, Eminent

viii) ve - Negative, Positive

Tricks to identify a Verb:

It is easy to identify verbs as they are action words. In case of confusion, look at words ending with -

- i) ed Breathed,
- ii) t Slept, Wept, Dreamt
- iii) ing Wailing, Borrowing

Synonyms and Antonyms: Tricks to identify an Adverb

Usually, adverbs end in -ly. Sometimes, adjectives also end with ly like costly, deadly, friendly, etc. There is one simple difference.

- Adverb = Adjective + ly (beautiful + ly)
- Adjective = Noun + ly (Friend + ly)

IMPORTANT CASE - For instance, the question asks you to find the synonym of a noun and all the four options are noun only. What should you do? Here, you need to identify the type of noun such as proper noun, common noun, collective noun, abstract noun, etc. and the option will be according to this type. This rule applies to <u>adjectives</u>, <u>verbs</u> and <u>adverbs</u> as <u>well</u>.

Synonyms and Antonyms: Word Analysis

- Q. Choose the synonym of Animate
- a) Dead
- b) Energize
- c) Calm
- d) Copy

Here, we can analyze the word 'animate'. We can relate it to animation which can mean cartoon or something that moves or has life. Hence, 'Energize' will be the synonym.






