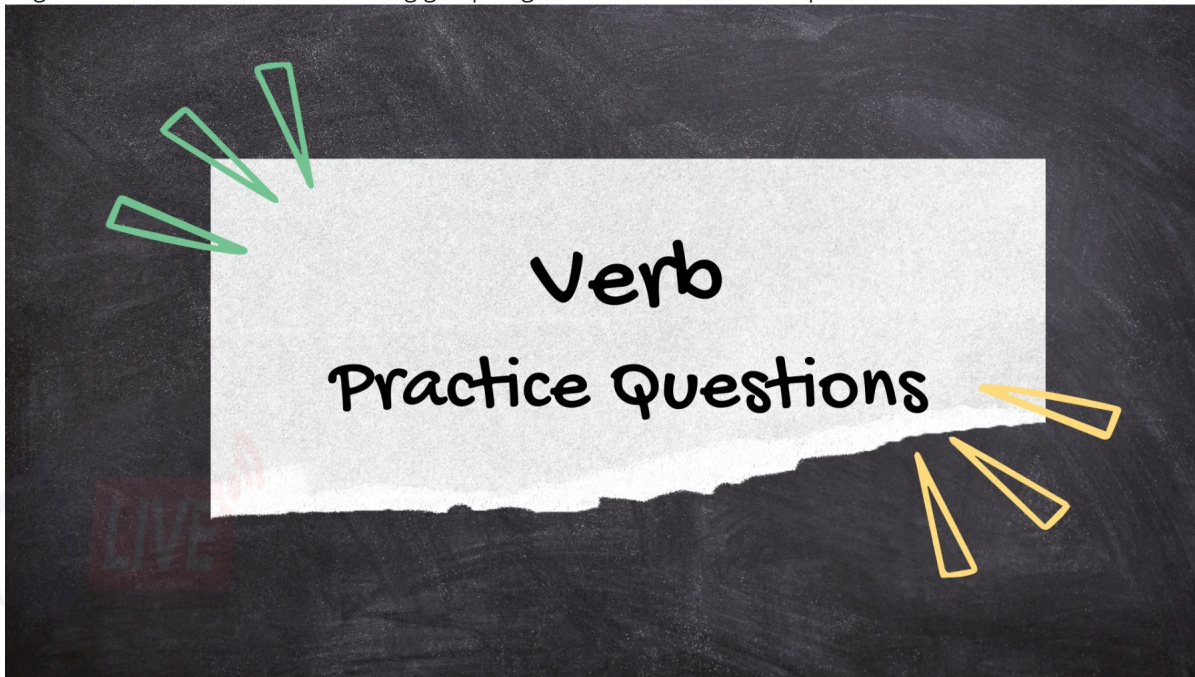


Verb Questions - 30 Difficulty Wise MCQs with Solutions

Solutions of Easy Level Verb Questions

Q:1 (2) "Stand by" is a phrasal verb that means to support or defend a decision or action. In this sentence, Maria is determined to support her innovative approach to the project despite the criticism she received from her colleagues.

Q:2 (3) "Turn off" is a separable phrasal verb, which means that the object (in this case, "the lights") can go either before or after the particle (in this case, "off"). Therefore, the sentence could also be written as "I need to turn the lights off before leaving the room".

Q:3 (3) "Jump at" is a phrasal verb that means to eagerly accept an opportunity or offer. In this sentence, John eagerly accepted the job offer without any hesitation.

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Solutions of Hard Level Verb Questions

Q:2 (2) "Buckle down" is a phrasal verb that means to work with increased focus and dedication to accomplish a task or goal. In this sentence, the team is determined to work harder and more efficiently to complete the project on time, despite falling behind schedule.

Q:3 (4) Here the phrasal verb iron out means to resolve by discussion for eliminating differences.

Q:4 (2) In the context of the sentence, take up means to pursue a matter later or further. Take-over means becoming responsible for a task. Takedown means to write down spoken words. Take off means choosing to have a break.

Q:5 (1) The most suitable phrasal verb is "decided upon" which means "to choose (something) after thinking about the possible choices".

Q:6 (1) The most suitable answer is "be along" which means "to arrive".
