The SSC CGL exam is conducted in two distinct tiers or stages:

Tier 1

- This is the preliminary stage conducted in a computer-based format. It's important to note that the Tier 1 exam is compulsory for all candidates and serves as the initial step in the SSC CGL selection process.
- Tier 1 comprises four subjects and consists of 100 questions, totaling 200 marks.
- Moreover, it lasts for one hour and features questions in both English and Hindi, except for English Comprehension.
- Lastly, it's essential to be aware that there's a penalty of 0.50 marks for each incorrect answer.

Tier 2

- Tier 2 consists of three papers: Paper I, Paper II, and Paper III.
- Paper I is mandatory for all candidates. Paper II is specifically for candidates applying for the Junior Statistical Officer (JSO) positions in the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation. Paper III is for candidates applying for the Assistant Audit Officer (AAO) or Assistant Accounts Officer (AAO) positions.
- Negative marking applies, with a deduction of 1 mark for each incorrect answer in Section I, Section II, and Module I of Section III of Paper I. In Paper II and Paper III, there is a penalty of 0.50 marks for every wrong answer.

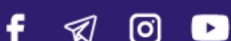
