

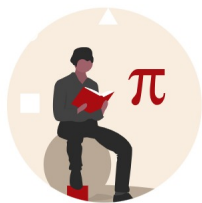

A major step towards cracking MTS exam is to familiarize yourself with the SSC MTS Exam Pattern 2023. Knowledge of SSC MTS Exam Pattern 2023 will make preparation rather focused for you. With a familiar exam pattern, we get a better understanding of important topics and practice questions. Our study is concentrated rather than scattered. But before directly proceeding on to the SSC MTS Exam Pattern 2023, how about we give you a chronology of all the levels of the MTS examination? Now that the MTS exam sequence is out of your way, how about we provide you with a thorough SSC MTS Exam Pattern 2023 for all these levels?

SSC MTS Exam Pattern 2023 - Computer Based Exam

Fistly, the SSC MTS Exam Pattern 2023 comprises of two stages: a Computer Based Exam and a Physical Efficiency Test or Physical Standard Test. The Physical Efficiency Test or Physical Standard Test is only if you want to become a havaladar for CBIN or CBN.

The CBE is divided into two sessions (both mandatory). The CBE is followed by a PET/PST (for hawaladar only). In this blog segment, we will only cater to the exam pattern of CBE, and the rest will follow through.

- The Computer Based Examination (CBE) is divided into two sessions, both of which are mandatory.
- There are 40 questions in **session 1**, and each question is of 3 marks.
- There are 50 questions in **session 2**, and each question is of 3 marks.
- The time allotted for both sessions is 45 minutes per session.
- Remember that there will be no negative marking in session 1.
- However, there will be a negative marking of 1 mark for each wrong answer in session 2. Take note that there will be no negative marking if you never attempted the question.
- However, if you fall under the category of candidates eligible for scribes, the duration for solving questions in both sessions will be 60 minutes per session.

Moreover, below we have provided you with a snippet directly from the MTS official notification for your reference purpose below:

We will further explain to you all the topics under each of these subjects in the SSC MTS Syllabus segment below. But for now, let us proceed to our next step in the exam journey, i.e., PET or PST.

SSC MTS 2023 Physical Standard Test/ Physical Endurance Test

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Secondly, in the SSC MTS Exam Pattern 2023, we have the Physical Standard Test (PST) or the Physical Endurance Test (PET). Once you clear the CBE, you will be required to appear for PST or PET. Please take note that PST/PET is mandatory for you to clear, if your goal is to become a havaldar in the Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs (CBIN) or the Central Bureau of Narcotics (CBN). Let us understand each of these in detail.

Physical Standards for Test

The PST can even be categorized as an eligibility criterion since it has standard requirements for the following:

- Height
- Chest
- Weight

However, these are different for men and women. Moreover, we have provided you with a table below to provide you with an understanding regarding the measurements of height, chest, and weight required for PST.

Details	Male	Female
Height(in cm)	157.5	152
Unexpanded Chest (in cm)	81	-
Expanded Chest (in cm)	86	-
Weight (in kg)	-	48

Now that you are well aware of the physical standards that you need to fulfil, let us proceed to know what is included in a Physical Efficiency Test.

Physical Efficiency Test

As the name suggests, it is a test to check the fitness level of the candidates who have cleared the Computer Based Examination and have even qualified for the PST. Let us understand these in detail.

Firstly, for Male Candidates, the PET includes the following test:

- 1600 meters in 15 minutes

Secondly, for Female Candidates, the PET includes the following test:

- 1 kilometer in 20 minutes

Moreover, if you are 12 weeks pregnant at the time of the PET test, then you will be declared temporarily unfit for examination. Your vacancy will however be secured for you, and you will be re-examined after six weeks from the date of delivery, or so if you provide a medical certificate of fitness from a registered medical professional (doctor).

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You may be exempted from the Physical Efficiency test if you have certain specified disabilities. Moreover, please take a note of the following:

S. No.	Suitable category for benchmark disability for post of Havaladar	Exemption in PET/PST
1.	HH	No exemption
2.	OA	No exemption
3.	OL	May be exempted from Walking
4.	OAL	May be exempted from Walking
5.	LC	May be exempted from Walking
6.	AAV	No exemption However. If due to acid attack the candidates suffer from orthopaedic disability i.e. OA, OL, OAL, then above exemption for OA , OL and OAL will apply
7.	MD involving above categories	Above exemption for HH ,OA , OL , OAL , LC , and AAV will apply

Abbreviations used: HH = Hard of Hearing, OA= One Arm, OL= One Leg, OAL= One Arm & One Leg, LC= Leprosy Cured, AAV = Acid Attack Victim, MD = Multiple Disabilities.

SSC MTS Notification 2023 Overview

For a moment, let's hit pause. We might be enthusiastic due to the release of the SSC MTS official notification 2023 by the Staff Selection Commission on 30th June 2023. This MTS recruitment exam has released a total of **1558 vacancies** for multi-tasking nontechnical staff, including vacancies for the Havaladar post. As for havaldars in CBIC or CBN, there are **360 vacancies**.

Also, this notification mentions all the necessary details you need to know about the job posts, salaries, eligibility, exam pattern, syllabus, or application process. SSC MTS 2023 Syllabus

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Now that we have brushed up on the SSC MTS Exam Pattern 2023 and have had an overview of the official notification, it is obvious you must be curious about what exactly you need to prepare for the MTS examinations. So, let's discuss the syllabus for the SSC MTS Examination.

In order to ace the SSC MTS examination, we need a core understanding of the subjects. The Computer Based Examination is divided into two sessions. Each session has two subjects.

Session 1

To further your knowledge of the SSC MTS Syllabus 2023, you should have an understanding of the following subjects:

- Numerical and Mathematical Ability, and
- Reasoning Ability and Problem Solving

There are certain facts about the session that you should be familiar with:

- There are 20 questions per subject.
- Each question is of 3 marks.
- There is no negative marking.

Session 2

According to the SSC MTS exam pattern, session 2 is also mandatory. There are 2 subjects like session 1 and those are:

- General Awareness
- English Language and Comprehension

Further, there are certain facts about session 2 that we need to understand. Those are:

- There are 25 questions per subject.
- Each question is worth 3 marks.
- Moreover, there is a negative marking of one mark for each wrong answer. Also, take note that there is no negative marking if you don't attempt a question.

SSC MTS 2023 Marking Scheme

- As we are aware, the SSC MTS recruitment examination in 2023 consists of two sessions. To clarify, both will comprise objective multiple-choice questions.
- Moreover, these questions will be presented in both Hindi or English or in 13 regional languages for paper 2 of session 1 and paper 1 of session 2.
- There is no negative marking in session 1 papers, however, there is a negative marking of one mark in session 2 papers.

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Now that you have gotten clear on the SSC MTS marking scheme, let us now learn about marks normalization for the SSC MTS examination 2023.

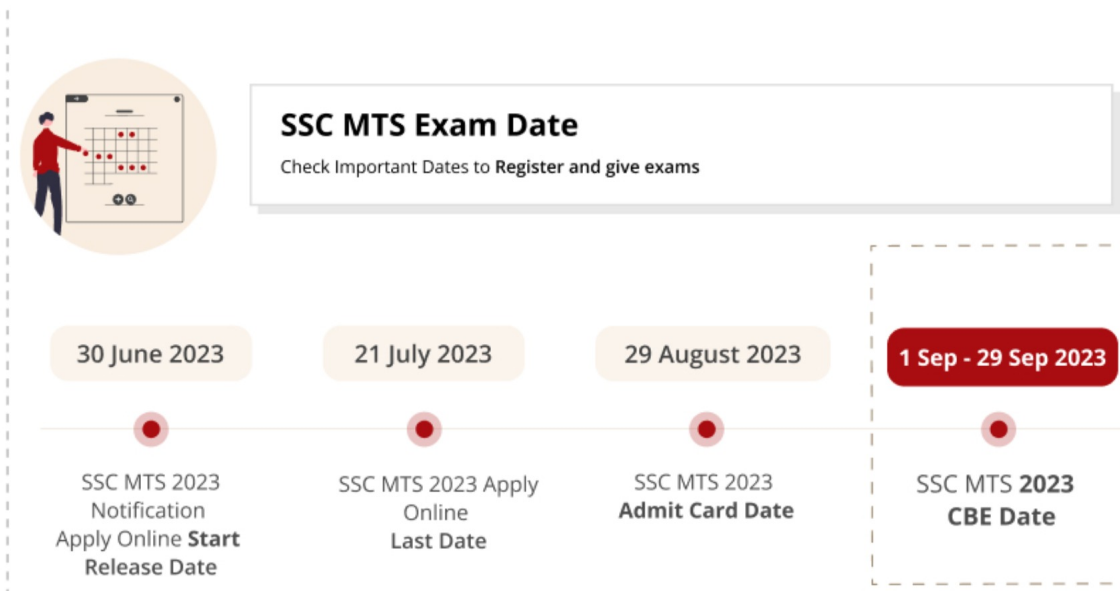
SSC MTS 2023 Marks Normalization

Additionally, it is crucial that you are aware of the normalization of marks and how it will take place in the examination. Normalization of marks is a method in which the marks of various candidates are brought to an equal level to prevent any disparities in the difficulty levels of question papers across multiple shifts of the same exam.

Moreover, according to the official notification, SSC will follow the formula mentioned in [Notice No.1-1/2018-P&P-I dated 07-02-2019](#). This normalized score will help determine the final merit and cut-off marks.

SSC MTS Exam Dates 2023
