Nationality:

1. Indian citizens are eligible.
2. Subjects of Nepal, or migrants from Vietnam, Pakistan, Burma, Sri Lanka, or East African countries (with the intention to settle permanently in India) can apply.

CDS Full Form - Eligibility, Selection Process, and Exam Pattern

Educational Qualifications:

- For I.M.A. and Officers' Training Academy, Chennai: A bachelor's degree from a recognized University or equivalent.
- For Indian Naval Academy: A degree in Engineering from a recognized University or Institution.
- For Air Force Academy: A degree from a recognized University (with Physics and Mathematics at 10+2 level) or a Bachelor of Engineering.

Please note that the Educational qualifications 'as on date' differs in every exam notification released by the UPSC.

Age Limit, Sex, and Marital Status:

- IMA & Indian Naval Academy: Unmarried male candidates aged 20 to 24.
- Air Force Academy: Unmarried males, 20 to 24 years old.
- Officers' Training Academy (SSC Course for men): Unmarried males aged 20 to 24.
- Officers' Training Academy (SSC Women Non-Technical Course): Unmarried women, widows without remarriage, or divorced women without remarriage, aged 20 to 24.

Understanding these criteria will help you determine if you meet the requirements for the CDS exam.
