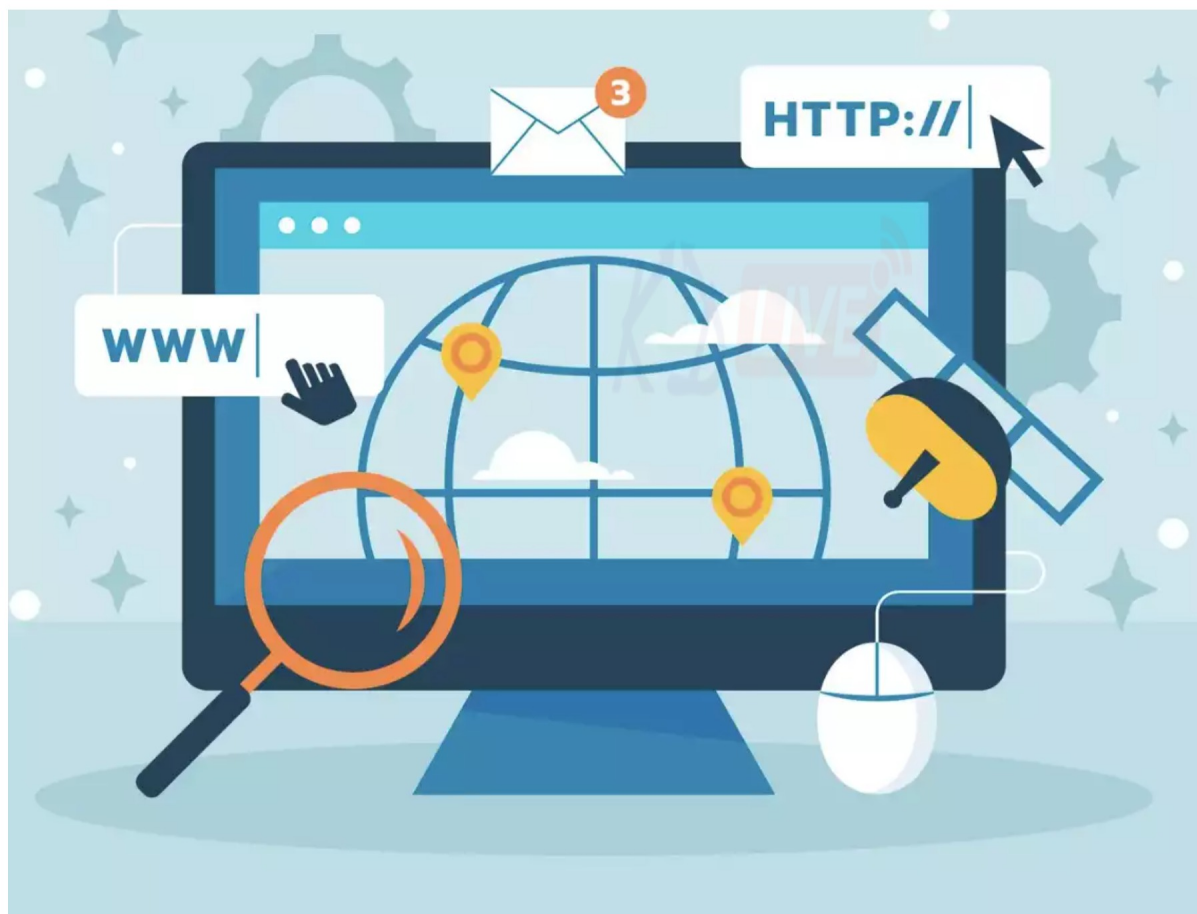




Connecting the World: World Wide Web Day

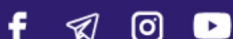
