










### Protecting the Red Panda: International Red Panda Day



# International Red Panda Day: Understanding Red Pandas

- **3. Diet:** Although they are classified as carnivores, red pandas primarily eat bamboo. Their diet also includes fruits, acorns, roots, and occasionally small insects and birds.
- **4. Behavior:** Red pandas are primarily solitary animals, with each individual having a defined territory. They are crepuscular, meaning they are most active during dawn and dusk. They are adept climbers, spending much of their time in trees.
- **5. Lifespan:** In the wild, red pandas have a lifespan of about 8 to 10 years, but they can live up to 15 years in captivity with proper care.

# International Red Panda Day: Threats to Red Pandas


