

History of Bhopal

Khan ventured into the politically unstable Malwa region and annexed territories, forming the Bhopal State. He even obtained Bhopal from the Gond queen Kamlapati, further solidifying his rule.
- The Era of Begum Rule: Bhopal entered the princely state era after a treaty with the British East India Company in 1818. The unique feature of Bhopal's history was the rule of four women, Begums, during the 19th century. Their reign brought significant progress to the city, including waterworks, railways, a postal system, and the establishment of a municipality.
- Post-Independence Transformation: After India gained independence in 1947, Bhopal merged with the Union of India in 1949, becoming a part of the Indian democratic landscape.
- The Bhopal Gas Tragedy: In December 1984, Bhopal was thrust into international consciousness due to the catastrophic Union Carbide gas leak, leading to one of the worst industrial disasters in history. The aftermath of this tragedy, including health issues and environmental damage, remains a significant socio-political issue.


Geographical Aspects of Bhopal

- Lakes: Boasts 17 lakes and 5 reservoirs, including the expansive Upper Lake (36 km²) and Lower Lake (1.29 km²).
- Hills: Idgah, Arera, Shyamala, and Katara hills embellish the city's landscape.

Physiographic Aspects:

Bhopal's climate is an intriguing blend, characterised by cool, dry winters and hot, humid summers.

- Climate: Bhopal's climate showcases intriguing contrasts. Summers, commencing in late March, witness scorching temperatures, with highs exceeding 40°C (104°F) in May. Monsoons, from late June to September, bring about 40 inches (1020 mm) of rainfall. Winters, from November to March, are relatively cool, with average daily temperatures around 16°C (61°F).
- Rainfall: Bhopal enjoys an annual rainfall of approximately 1146 mm (46 inches).
- **Temperature:** The city experiences a wide temperature range, from scorching summer highs to chilly winter nights. The highest recorded temperature was 46.7°C in May, and the lowest was 0.3°C during winter.

Bhopal's physiographic diversity, from lush hills to serene lakes, combined with its climate nuances, creates a captivating tapestry for both residents and visitors to appreciate.

Demographic Snapshot:

Bhopal, a vibrant city, shelters a diverse population with intriguing statistics.

- Population: In 2011, Bhopal city's population stood at 1,798,218, with 936,168 males and 862,050 females.

Soil and Vegetation:


Bhopal's geographic allure extends to its soil and vegetation.

Political Aspects of Bhopal
