History of Indore

Local zamindars agreed to pay, and by 1720, the headquarters of the pargana was shifted from Kampel to Indore due to increased commercial activity. The Marathas maintained friendly relations with Nandlal Chaudhary and further solidified their rule in the region.
- **Princely State:** Ahilyabai Holkar, a remarkable and courageous ruler, took the reins of Indore. Her rule, starting in the 18th century, marked a golden age in the city's history. She was known for constructing hundreds of Hindu temples and Dharmashalas, including the renowned Kashi Vishwanath Temple, Shri Rama Temple in Ayodhya, and many others.
- **Post-Independence:** In 1947, after India's independence, Holkar State, including Indore, became part of the Indian Union. It went on to become the commercial capital of the state of Madhya Pradesh, with a population that has grown to nearly 4.5 million in recent years.

This historical tapestry of Indore, marked by ancient inscriptions, Maratha influence, and the legacy of Ahilyabai Holkar, reflects a city that has evolved through the centuries into the dynamic urban centre it is today.

Geographical Aspects of Indore

Indore is located in the western region of Madhya Pradesh (approx. 76°E, 23°N) on the southern edge of the Malwa plateau, with an average altitude of 553 metres (1,814 ft) above sea level, giving it the highest elevation among major cities in Central India. The city is located 190 km west of the state capital, Bhopal. The city is distributed over a land area of approximately 530 square kilometres, and its infrastructure and layout are designed to accommodate its dense population.

Geographical Features:

- **River:** The city is situated on the banks of two small rivulets , the Saraswati and the Khan.
- **Hills:** It is surrounded by hills on three sides, with the Vindhya range to the south.

Physiographic Aspects:

- **Climate:** Indore has a tropical savanna climate, Summer is hot and dry, with temperatures ranging from 30 to 45 degrees Celsius and Winter is mild, with temperatures ranging from 10 to 25 degrees Celsius
- **Monsoon:** The monsoon season lasts from June to September and brings heavy rainfall, averaging 700 to 800 millimetres (28 to 31 inches).
- **Air Quality Index:** Generally good to moderate, but can become poor during the winter months due to air pollution. The current AQI of Indore City is 159, which is in the Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups category.

Demographic Snapshot:

- **Population:** Indore has a population of over 3.5 million people, making it the most populous city in Madhya Pradesh.
- **Gender Ratio:** The city has a gender ratio of 920 females per 1000 males.
- **Density:** The population density of the city is 6,724 people per square kilometre.
- **Literacy Rate:** It has a literacy rate of 82.32%, which is higher than the national average.

Soil and Vegetation:

- Indore has black cotton soil, which is fertile and well-suited for agriculture.
- It is also known for its fertility and is well-suited for growing a variety of crops, including cotton, wheat, soybeans, and pulses.
- The city is surrounded by forests, which are home to a variety of trees and plants.
- The planted vegetation is mostly ornamental, with trees such as gulmohar, jacaranda, and bougainvillea.

Political Aspects of Indore

Indore has a city government, or municipality, with a mayor-council form of government. It was the first city in India to have an elected municipal government.

- The Indore Municipal Corporation (IMC) is spread over an area of 269 square km and consists of 69 Council members whose districts are divided into 12 zones and these zones had been further divided into 85 wards defined by geographic population boundaries.
- The mayor and councillors are elected to five-year terms. The elected wing of the city government is headed by the Mayor.
- The IMC is responsible for public education, correctional institutions, libraries, public safety, recreational facilities, sanitation, water supply, local planning, and welfare services.
- Indore city is represented in the parliament through the Indore Lok Sabha constituency, which covers most of the district. As per delimitation from 2008, It is represented in the state assembly constituency through 5 Constituencies.
- The Indore Police, a division of the Madhya Pradesh Police, is under the direct control of the Department of Home Affairs. The government of Madhya Pradesh is the law enforcement agency in Indore. Indore district is divided into 39 police stations and seven police outposts.
- Indore is also a seat for one of the two permanent benches of Madhya Pradesh High Court with Gwalior, the city, its agglomerates, and other 12 districts of western Madhya Pradesh falling under the jurisdiction of Indore High Court.
- Most of the regions surrounding the city are administered by the Indore Development Authority (IDA). IDA works as an apex body for planning and coordination of development activities in the Indore Metropolitan Region (IMR) comprising Indore and its agglomeration covering an area of 398.72 km² (153.95 sq mi).

Indore is a well-governed city with a strong focus on public service delivery. The city government has been successful in providing clean drinking water, sanitation, and other essential services to its residents. It is also one of the cleanest cities in India and has been ranked as the cleanest city in the country for the past six years in a row.
