

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

Nationality:

You must be an Indian citizen, a subject of Nepal or Bhutan, or a person of Indian origin who has migrated from specific countries with the intention of permanently settling in India (detailed in the blog).



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Age:

Applicants should be between 18 and 32 years old. Note that some positions may have slightly different age requirements.

Educational Qualifications:

The degree required varies by the specific post:

- Assistant Audit Officer/Assistant Accounts Officer: Bachelor's Degree from a recognized university or institute.
- Junior Statistical Officer: Bachelor's Degree in any subject with a minimum of 60% marks in Mathematics at the 12th standard level, or a Bachelor's Degree with Statistics as a subject.
- Statistical Investigator Grade II: Bachelor's Degree with Statistics as one of the subjects.
- · All Other Posts: Bachelor's Degree from a recognized university or equivalent.

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

Understanding the exam pattern is crucial for SSC CGL aspirants as it helps them grasp the structure and format of the exam, allowing them to plan their strategy effectively. Let's explore the SSC CGL exam pattern. The SSC CGL Recruitment exam will be conducted in two tiers, detailed as follows:

Tier 1:







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- The SSC CGL Tier-1 Exam will be conducted online and will comprise 4 sections.
- A total of 100 multiple choice questions (MCQs) will be asked, with a maximum of 200 marks.
- The entire exam must be completed within 60 minutes.
- There will be a negative marking of 0.50 marks for each incorrect answer.

Tier 2:

- The SSC CGL Tier 2 Exam 2024 will be conducted in three phases: Paper I, Paper II, and Paper III.
- Paper I is mandatory, and you must successfully pass all its sections.
- Negative marking will be applied: 1 mark will be deducted for each incorrect answer in Section I, Section II, and Module I of Section III in Paper I, and 0.50 marks for each wrong answer in Paper II and Paper III.
- All questions, except for the English Comprehension section, will be available in both English and Hindi.







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

CGL Exam Details - Marking Scheme

Understanding the marking scheme is crucial for accurately calculating your scores. Here are the key points:



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- Tier I: The exam consists of 100 questions, totaling 200 marks, with each question worth 2 marks. There is a penalty of 0.50 marks for each incorrect answer.
- Tier II: There is a deduction of 1 mark for each incorrect answer in Section-I, Section-II, and Module-I of Section-III of Paper-I. For Paper II and Paper III, there is a penalty of 0.50 marks for each wrong answer.

CGL Exam Details - Syllabus

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The SSC CGL syllabus for Tier 1 includes four sections: General Intelligence & Reasoning, General Awareness, Quantitative Aptitude, and English Comprehension. Let's review the complete syllabus and marking scheme for the Tier 1 stage in SSC CGL.

The SSC CGL Tier-1 exam is mandatory for all posts and is qualifying in nature. It is conducted for a total of 200 marks. Candidates must answer 25 questions from each of the four sections within 1 hour. Each question carries 2 marks, and there is a negative marking penalty of 0.5 marks for each incorrect answer.

The four subjects in Tier 1 are:

- General Intelligence and Reasoning
- General Awareness
- Quantitative Aptitude
- English Comprehension

Thereafter, Tier 2 includes three papers:

- **Paper I:** Mathematical Abilities, Reasoning and General Intelligence, English Language and Comprehension, General Awareness, Computer Knowledge Module, and Data Entry Speed Test Module.
- · Paper II: Statistics
- Paper III: General Studies (Finance and Economics)
