- This total includes perks such as House Rent Allowance (HRA), travel allowance, Dearness Allowance (DA), and others.
- For example, if the Basic Pay for a post is Rs. 44,900, the House Rent Allowance provided will be 24% of the Basic Pay, amounting to Rs. 10,776.
- Additionally, the travel allowance provided will be Rs. 3600, as the assumed Grade Pay falls between Grade Pay levels of 2000 to 4800.

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

The SSC CGL exam is held in two distinct tiers or stages:

- **Tier 1**: The first stage is the qualifying exam, which is conducted in a computer-based format. It's essential to understand that the Tier 1 exam is compulsory for all candidates, marking the initial step in the SSC CGL selection process.
- Tier 2: In the SSC CGL exam, Tier 2 consists of three papers. Paper I is mandatory for all candidates. Paper II is designed for candidates applying for Junior Statistical Officer (JSO) positions in the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation. Paper III is for candidates applying for Assistant Audit Officer (AAO) or Assistant Accounts Officer (AAO) positions.

- English Comprehension


