- The in-hand salary for each post varies based on its pay grade, ranging from Rs. 25,500 to Rs. 1,51,100.
- This total includes various perks such as House Rent Allowance (HRA), travel allowance, Dearness Allowance (DA), and others.
- If the Basic Pay for the post is Rs. 44,900, then the House Rent Allowance provided will be 24% of the Basic Pay, which amounts to Rs. 10,776.
- Additionally, the travel allowance provided will be Rs. 3600, as the assumed Grade Pay falls between Grade Pay levels of 2000 to 4800.

The SSC CGL exam is held in two distinct tiers or stages:

- **Tier 1:** The initial stage is the qualifying examination, which is conducted in a computer-based format. It's important to note that the Tier 1 exam is mandatory for all candidates, serving as the first step in the SSC CGL selection process.
- **Tier 2:** Tier 2 of the SSC CGL exam is subdivided into three papers. Paper I is compulsory for all applicants. Paper II is specifically for candidates applying for the Junior Statistical Officer (JSO) positions in the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation. Paper III is for candidates applying for the Assistant Audit Officer (AAO) or Assistant Accounts Officer (AAO) positions.

Furthermore, following the Tier 1 examination, candidates are selected based on their marks, taking into account various categories, to proceed to the Tier 2 Examinations.
