

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

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

CGL Exam Syllabus - Tier 2

The Tier 2 exam includes separate shifts or days for Paper 1, Paper 2, and Paper 3. Paper 1 is mandatory for all candidates. Additionally, Paper 3 is exclusively for individuals shortlisted for Assistant Audit Officer/Assistant Accounts Officer positions in Tier 1.

- Paper 1 covers Mathematical Abilities, Reasoning and General Intelligence, English Language and Comprehension,
 General Awareness, and modules on Computer Knowledge and Data Entry Speed Test.
- · Paper 2 focuses on Statistics.
- Paper 3 addresses topics related to General Studies in Finance and Economics.

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CGL Exam Syllabus - Marking Scheme

The CGL Exam consists of 100 questions in the Tier 1 examination, with each question carrying a weight of 2 marks. There is a negative marking of 0.5 marks for each incorrect answer. In the Tier 2 examination, there are three papers: Paper 1 includes 150 questions along with a data entry task; Paper 2, which focuses on Statistics, consists of 100 questions; and Paper 3, covering General Studies, also includes 100 questions. It's important to note that questions in both Paper 1 and Paper 2 are worth 2 marks each. For information on the minimum marks required for each category, refer to the table below:

CGL Exam Syllabus - Normalization

Now that we comprehensively understand the CGL Exam Syllabus, its exam pattern, and the associated marking scheme, let's explore the concept of marks normalization. What exactly is marks normalization? It is a statistical technique designed to account for any variations in the difficulty levels of question papers across different shifts of the same examination. Since different shifts may have varying degrees of difficulty, a straightforward score comparison might not be fair. Normalization addresses this issue by equalizing the scores, ensuring a more equitable evaluation of candidates.

Additionally,

SSC

published the formula that will be used for normalization in

Notice No.1-1/2018-P&P-I

dated 07-02-2019. These normalized scores are then used to determine the final merit and cut-off marks.
