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

The SSC CGL Tier 1 exam features four subjects, including General Intelligence and Reasoning, General Awareness, Quantitative Aptitude and English Comprehension. Each subject has 25 questions, making a total of 100 questions worth 200 marks. The English Comprehension section specifically includes 25 questions for 50 marks. The total exam duration is 1 hour, and all questions are Objective Type and Multiple Choice, available in both English and Hindi, except for the English Comprehension section which is only in English.

When you progress to the SSC CGL Tier 2 exam, you'll encounter two distinct phases: Paper I and Paper II. It's important to note that Paper I is compulsory for all applicants. If you're specifically applying for the Junior Statistical Officer (JSO) in the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation and Statistical Investigator Grade-II in the office of Registrar General of India (M/o Home Affairs).
