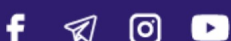

The SSC CGL Tier I exam consists of 100 questions, equally divided among four subjects, with 25 questions per subject. Each correct answer earns you 1 mark, while incorrect answers incur a penalty of 0.50 marks. Therefore, it's important to answer questions carefully.

Paper-I will be administered in two sessions—Session I and Session II—on the same day. Tier II, which includes Paper I and Paper II, will feature objective-type multiple-choice questions, except for Module II of Section III in Paper I. The questions will be available in both English and Hindi, with the exception of the English Language and Comprehension module in Section II of Paper I. There will be a penalty of 1 mark for each incorrect answer in Section I, Section II, and Module I of Section III of Paper I, while Paper II will have a negative marking of 0.50 marks for wrong answers.
