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Polity for SSC CGL 2024: Weightage

The

Staff Selection Commission

(SSC) has not disclosed the specific weightage assigned to each topic in the Polity section for the SSC CGL 2024 exam. However, analyzing the overall structure and past exam trends enables us to make some informed conclusions:

- The General Awareness Section in Tier I constitutes 25% of the exam, with 50 marks out of a total of 200. In Tier II, General Awareness comprises 25 questions, each worth 3 marks, totalling 75 marks.
- Focus on topics such as the Constitution of India, Articles and Amendments, and Judiciary.
- It will be helpful to learn about current events and how they affect Indian politics.

According to past year's question papers, Polity consists of 1-2 questions. It is not possible to figure out how these questions are distributed exactly among various topics and subtopics. Therefore, your primary attention should be on understanding the fundamental ideas of the Indian Constitution as well as the political structures and rules of governance. 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Polity for SSC CGL 2024 - Topics and Weightage

The SSC CGL Tier I exam consists of four subjects, with each subject containing 25 questions. This totals 100 questions, each worth 2 marks, making the maximum score 200 marks. The exam is conducted over a 1 hour period and consists of Objective Type Multiple Choice Questions (MCQs). All questions, except those in the English Comprehension section, are available in both English and Hindi. There is a penalty of 0.50 marks for each incorrect answer.

In Tier II of the SSC CGL exam, Paper I and Paper II will be administered either in separate shifts or on different days. Paper I is mandatory for all candidates, while Paper II is required only for those applying for Junior Statistical Officer (JSO) positions in the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation or Statistical Investigator Grade-II roles in the office of the Registrar General of India, and who are shortlisted in Tier 1 for these posts.



Polity for SSC CGL 2024 - Topics and Weightage

Tier II of the SSC CGL exam, including both Paper I and Paper II, will feature Objective Type Multiple Choice Questions. However, Module II of Section III of Paper I will not follow this format. Questions will be available in both English and Hindi, except for the English Language and Comprehension module in Section II of Paper I. There will be a penalty of 1 mark for each incorrect answer in Section I, Section II, and Module I of Section III of Paper I, and a penalty of 0.50 marks for each incorrect answer in Paper II.
