Additionally, the questions are provided in both English and Hindi, except for the English Language and Comprehension module in Section II of Paper I. There is a negative marking system in place: 1 mark will be deducted for each incorrect answer in Section I, Section II, and Module I of Section III of Paper I. For Paper II, 0.50 marks will be deducted for each incorrect answer.
