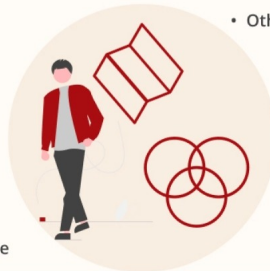

Reasoning for SSC CHSL – Priority Wise Topics

Tier 2 of the SSC CHSL exam includes two sessions on the same day: Session I and Session II. Session I is dedicated to Module II of Section I, which encompasses Reasoning and General Intelligence, featuring 30 questions, each valued at 3 marks. This section plays a crucial role in the exam. Below is a breakdown of the key Reasoning Topics for SSC CHSL 2024:

- **Series:** This topic generally includes 3 to 8 questions, focusing on Mixed Series, Number Series, and Alphabet Series.

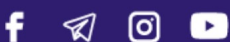
