

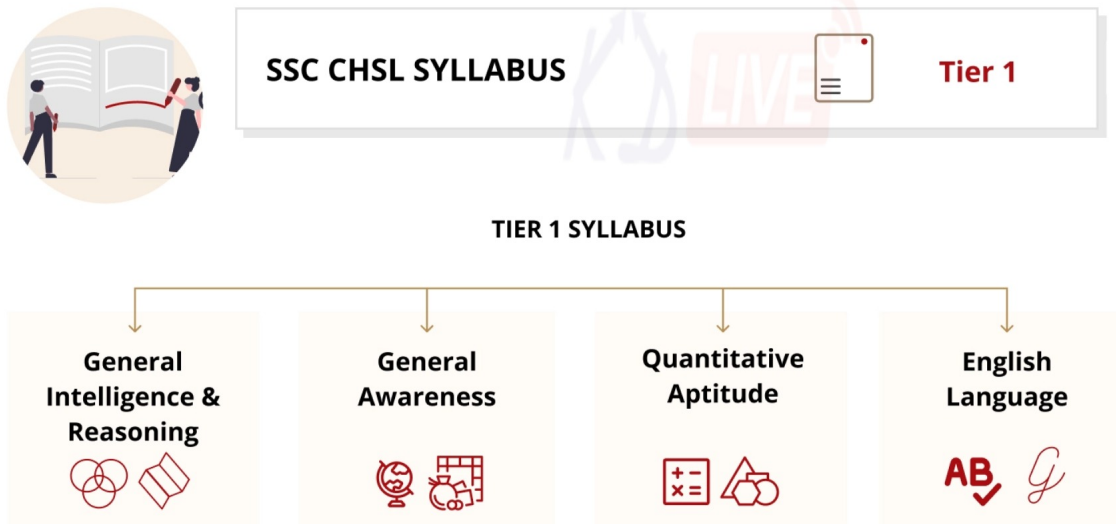

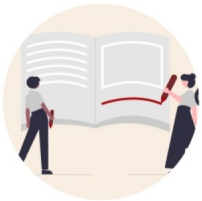

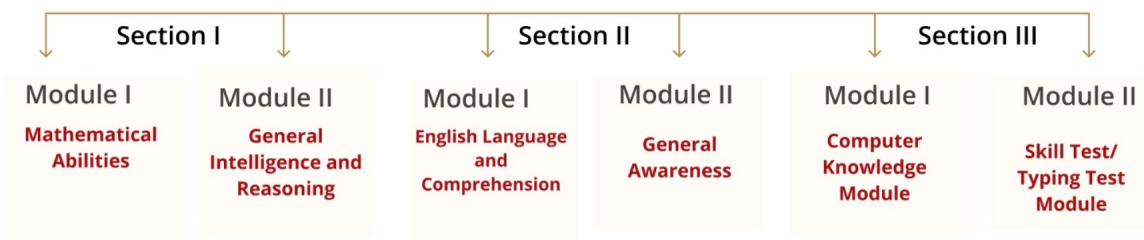

As per the official notification by the SSC, there are two Tiers in the SSC CHSL exam. Firstly, the Tier-1 examination consists of objective-type multiple-choice questions and covers above mentioned four subjects. Additionally, it's important to note that Tier 1 includes a negative marking of 0.5 marks for each wrong answer.

Certainly, the Tier-2 examination from the last year has been conducted in two different sessions - Session-I and Session-II, both on the same day. Most importantly, please note that in Session I, the conducting will include Section I, Section II, and Module I of Section III. Moreover, this Tier consists of a negative marking of 1 mark for each wrong answer in Section I, Section II, and Module I of Section III.

We hope that now you have an image of all the subjects you need to prepare for. Hence, moving further we will provide you with all the details you need to be aware of. So let's delve into it.

# SSC CHSL Syllabus 2023 - Tier 1

According to the official notification by the SSC, there are two tiers in the SSC CHSL exam. Additionally, it is important to note that the sections in Tier - 1 carry 50 marks each. However, this Tier consists of a negative marking of 0.5 marks for each wrong answer as well. Thus, you should only mark answers when you are absolutely sure. In the Tier 1 exam, there will be four different sections, which will include:

- English Language - 25 questions
- Quantitative Aptitude - 25 questions
- Logical Reasoning - 25 questions
- General Awareness - 25 question

Therefore, the total number of questions are 100 questions.

Above all let's see all the topics that will be asked in these sections, and their weightage, with the help of the tables.

Subsequently, the table given below includes the topic-wise weightage for the English Language section.

Secondly, please take note that Session-I will include conducting of Section-I: Module I and II, Section-II: Module I and II and Section-III: Module I. Session II include Section III : Module III. Moreover, this tier consists of a negative marking of 1 mark for each wrong answer. Therefore, let's understand each session individually in detail.

## SSC CHSL Marking Scheme 2023

As we are aware, the SSC CHSL exam is conducted in two tiers. To clarify, both tiers comprise objective-type multiple-choice questions. Henceforth, check out the pointers given below for a better understanding:

- In Tier 1, for each correct answer, you will be **awarded 2 marks**.
- While there will be a negative marking of **0.50 marks for each wrong answer**.
- On the other hand in Tier 2, for each correct answer **3 marks will be awarded**.
- But for each wrong answer, **1 mark will be deducted**.

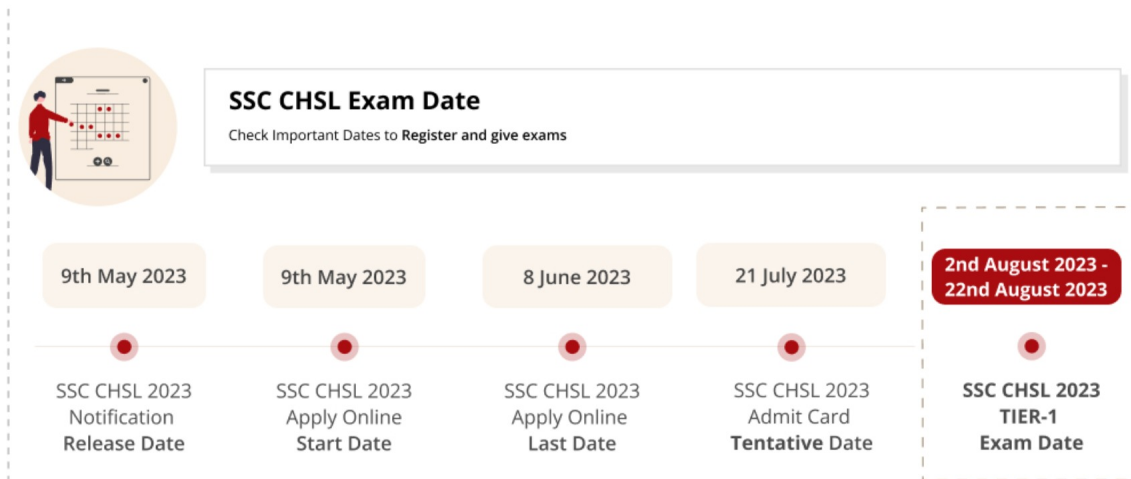
You are, therefore, advised to keep the marking scheme in mind while answering the questions. Last but not the least, it is also crucial to be familiar with the important dates regarding the SSC CHSL Exam 2023.

## SSC CHSL 2023 Marks Normalization

What do you understand by Normalization? Sometimes, different versions of the same exam can have questions of varying difficulty levels. Consequently, this can make it tricky to directly compare the scores of students who took different versions because some might have had it easier or harder. However, normalization fixes this by making scores more equal, which helps to evaluate all students fairly. Moreover, the marks scored by candidates in Computer Based Examination will be normalized by using the formula published by the Commission through **Notice No.1-1/2018-P&P-I dated 07-02-2019** and such normalized scores will be used to determine final merit and cut-off marks.
