

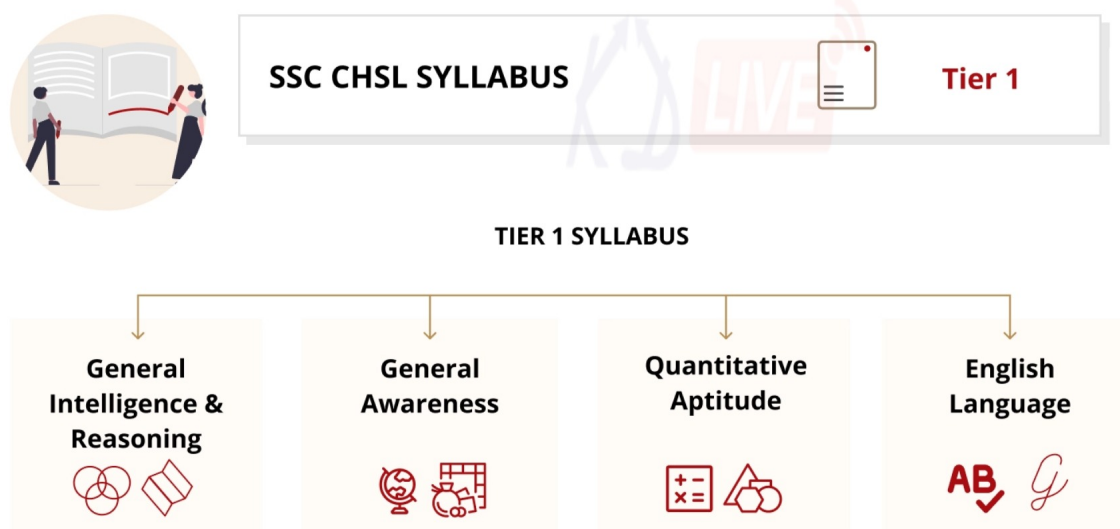

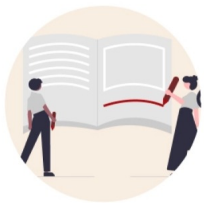

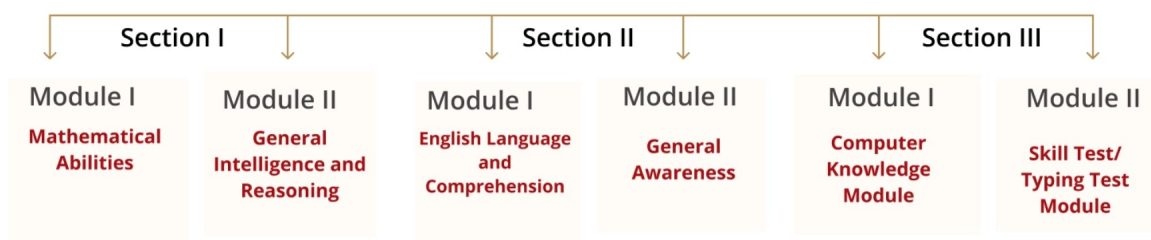

To begin with, since 2022, the Tier 2 exam has been divided into two separate sessions: Session-I and Session-II, both held on the same day. Secondly, it's important to acknowledge that Session-I will encompass the administration of Section-I: Module I and II, Section-II: Module I and II, and Section-III: Module I. On the other hand, Session-II will focus on Section III: Module III. To facilitate your comprehension, a series of images has been provided under this heading. Additionally, this tier incorporates a penalty of 1 mark for each incorrect answer, so let's delve into the specifics of each session individually.

SSC CHSL Marking Scheme

As known, the SSC CHSL examination is organized in two tiers. To elaborate, both tiers consist of objective-type multiple-choice questions. Refer to the following guidelines for clarity:

- In Tier 1, you will receive 2 marks for every correct answer.
- There is a penalty of 0.50 marks for each incorrect response.
- In Tier 2, each correct answer is rewarded with 3 marks, but for every incorrect answer, 1 mark will be deducted.

SSC CHSL Marks Normalization

To start, let's first understand the concept of normalization. Normalization is a statistical technique that accounts for variations in the difficulty levels of question papers across different shifts of the same examination. A direct comparison of scores may not be fair due to potential differences in the complexity of questions among shifts. To ensure a more equitable evaluation of candidates, normalization addresses this issue by equalizing the scores.

Hence, SSC published the formula that will be followed in **Notice No.1-1/2018-P&P-I dated 07-02-2019**. These standardized scores will be utilized to determine the cut-off marks, ultimately resulting in the creation of the merit list.
