

The SSC CHSL exam is divided into two tiers. It's important to note that each section in Tier 1 carries 50 marks, and there is a negative marking of 0.50 marks for each incorrect answer. Therefore, it is advisable to only mark answers when you are certain.

In the Tier 1 exam, there are four sections, each with 25 questions:

- English Language
- · Quantitative Aptitude
- · Logical Reasoning
- · General Awareness


, which has been in use since then. These normalized scores are subsequently used to determine the final merit list and cut-off marks.
