

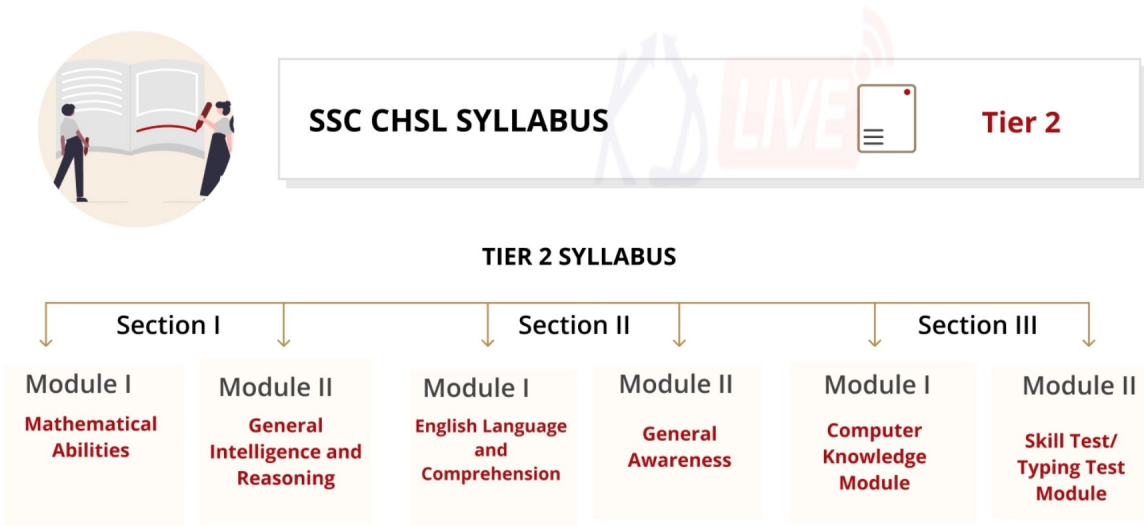

The SSC CHSL exam is divided into two tiers. Indeed, the Tier 2 examination is conducted in two sessions - Session I and Session II, both held on the same day. It's important to note that in Session I, the exam includes Section I, Section II, and Module I of Section III. Additionally, this Tier features a negative marking of 1 mark for each incorrect answer in Section I, Section II, and Module I of Section III. SSC CHSL Tier 2 Syllabus - Topics

The Tier 2 exam is conducted in two sessions: Session I and Session II, both on the same day. In Session I, Section I includes Modules I and II, similarly, Section II includes Modules I and II, and Section III includes Module I. Moreover, Session II includes Section III: Module II. It is evident from the above table that **Series** holds the maximum weightage, which is then followed **Analogies** and **Coding Decoding**.

It can be observed that **Geometry** and **DI** hold the maximum weightage as compared to other topics in Quantitative Aptitude.

SSC CHSL Tier 2 Syllabus - Marking Scheme

Now that you have all the details about the SSC CHSL Tier 2 Syllabus and its exam pattern, let's examine the marking scheme. To get a clearer picture, consider the following:

- In Tier 2, you will receive 3 marks for each correct answer.
- However, there will be a negative marking of 1 mark for each wrong answer in Section I, Section II and Module I of Section III.

Shall we now move on to discuss marks normalization for the SSC CHSL Tier 2 examination?



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SSC CHSL Tier 2 Syllabus - Marks Normalization

Let's begin by defining the concept of marks normalization. This is a statistical technique employed to compensate for any differences in the difficulty levels of question papers across various shifts of the exam. Comparing scores directly between shifts would be unfair due to these variations in question complexity. Normalization ensures that scores are equalized, enabling a more precise evaluation of candidates and resolving this discrepancy.

In 2019, the Staff Selection Commission introduced the normalization formula in

Notice No.1-1/2018-P&P-I dated 07-02-2019

, which has been in use since then. These normalized scores are subsequently used to determine the final merit list and cut-off marks.
