SSC Combined Graduate Level Syllabus - Tier 2

Tier 2 will involve the conducting of Paper-I, Paper-II, and Paper-III on separate shifts or days.



Paper I is mandatory for all candidates. Paper II is specifically for those applying for the Junior Statistical Officer (JSO) position in the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation. Paper 3 is intended for candidates aiming for the roles of Assistant Audit Officer or Assistant Accounts Officer.

- Paper I includes sections on Mathematical Abilities, Reasoning and General Intelligence, English Language and Comprehension, General Awareness, a Computer Knowledge Module, and a Data Entry Speed Test Module.
- Paper II focuses on Statistics, while Paper III covers General Studies, with an emphasis on Finance and Economics.

Let's now examine each topic and the weight assigned to it.

In summary, the table above indicates that the most weightage is of reading comprehension, which is followed by sentence rearrangement/jumbles, fillers, and synonyms and antonyms.



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

SSC Combined Graduate Level Marking Scheme

We will now take a look at the marking scheme tier-wise. Let us first begin with the marking scheme of SSC combined graduate level Tier 1:

- The SSC combined graduate level syllabus Exam includes 100 questions in the Tier 1 examination, with each question carrying 2 marks.
- There is also a negative marking of 0.50 marks for each incorrect answer.

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Moving on to the Tier 2 examination:

- The tier 2 exam consists of 3 papers.
- Paper I comprises 150 questions along with a data entry task.
- Paper II (Statistics) has 100 questions.
- Paper III (General Studies) has 100 questions.
- Each incorrect answer in Section-I, Section-II, and Module-I of Section-III in Paper-I will incur a deduction of 1 mark, while in Paper-II and Paper-III, each wrong answer will result in a deduction of 0.50 marks.



. These normalized scores are then applied to calculate the cut-off marks and final merit.
