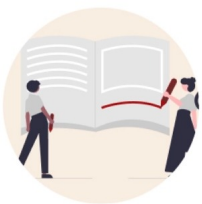
SSC MTS Exam Syllabus - Exam Overview

[Staff Selection Commission](#)

conducts a competitive examination to recruit Multi-Tasking (Non-Technical) Staff, a General Central Service Group 'C' Non-Gazetted, Non-Ministerial posts, for various Ministries, Departments, and Offices of the Government of India, along with different Constitutional Bodies, Statutory Bodies, and Tribunals across States and Union Territories. Additionally, the exam also recruits for the post of Havaldar, a Group 'C' Non-Gazetted, Non-Ministerial position, under the Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs (CBIC) and the Central Bureau of Narcotics (CBN), both functioning under the Department of Revenue, Ministry of Finance.

The SSC MTS CBT Exam is scheduled for October-November 2024. The exam for the MTS post will include a Computer-Based Examination (CBE). For the Havaldar post, the exam will include a CBE, a Physical Efficiency Test (PET), and a Physical Standard Test (PST). The CBE will be held in two sessions: Session I and Session II, both of which you must take on the same day. The CBE will cover four subjects: Numerical and Mathematical Ability, Reasoning Ability and Problem Solving, General Awareness, and English Language and Comprehension. 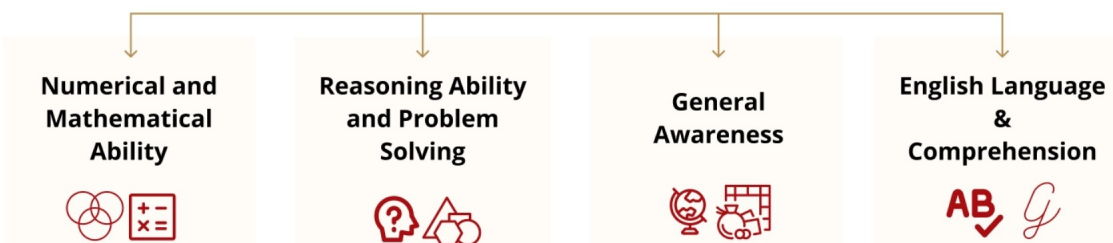

The SSC MTS Exam Pattern features a Computer-Based Examination available in 15 languages and is held in two mandatory sessions: Session I and Session II. It's important to attempt both sessions, as missing either will result in disqualification. While Session I does not have negative marking, Session II will deduct 1 mark for each incorrect answer.

SSC MTS Exam Syllabus - PET/PST

If you're applying for the Havaldar post, you'll need to pass a Physical Efficiency Test (PET) and a Physical Standard Test (PST) after clearing the Computer-Based Examination (CBE). These tests are designed to ensure that you meet the physical requirements necessary for the role. Make sure to prepare thoroughly to meet these standards and enhance your chances of success. The PET/PST standards for the Havaldar position in CBIC and CBN are as follows:

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Physical Efficiency Test (PET):

The criteria for the Physical Efficiency Test (PET) for the Havaldar position in CBIC and CBN are as follows:

Walking	1600 meters in 15 minutes.	1 Km in 20 minutes

Physical Standard Test (PST):

The minimum physical standards required for the Havaldar position in CBIC and CBN are:

Male:

Height	Chest
157.5 cms. (relaxable by 5 cms. in the case of Garhwalis, Assamese, Gorkhas and members of Schedule Tribes)	Chest-81 cms. (fully expanded with minimum expansion of 5 cms.)

Female:

Height	Weight
152 cms. relaxable by 2.5 Cms in the case of Garhwalis, Assamese, Gorkhas and members of Schedule Tribes)	48 kg (relaxable by 2 Kg in the case of Garhwalis, Assamese, Gorkhas and members of Schedule Tribes)

After the results are announced, you will need to undergo Document Verification. During this process, you must present various documents, including those related to caste/category, equivalency, matriculation/secondary certificates, persons with disabilities, age relaxation, and more. Additionally, government employees must provide a "No Objection Certificate."
